ssk - Slip next 2 stitches knitwise, one at a time, to right needle, then insert left needle through fronts of both stitches and k2tog tbl.
kf&b Knit into front and back of next stitch.

INSTRUCTIONS

Back:

Using smaller needles and Cream, cast on 66(70, 78) sts and work ribbing as follows:

Row 1: (right side) K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 2: P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end. Repeat these 2 rows once more. Change to Red and rep Rows 1 and 2 once.

Change to Cream and continue in ribbing as set until band measures 2.5" [6.5 cm], ending after a Row 2 and inc 1(3, 3) sts evenly across last rib row - 67(73, 81) sts.

Change to larger needles and beg with a k row, proceed to follow Back Graph in St st (one row k, one row p). Work border designs in "Fair Isle Stranding" method, deer and trees in "Colored Pattern" knitting method, using small balls of color for each section of the design.

Remember always to cross yarns when changing colors to avoid leaving a hole in the knitting.

Cast off and dec for armholes as indicated.

Cast off on last row.

Right Front: Using smaller needles and Cream, cast on 33(33, 37) sts and work ribbing as follows:

Row 1: (right side) K5, *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 2: P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to last 3 sts, k3.

**Repeat these 2 rows once more. Change to Red and rep Rows 1 and 2 once.

Change to Cream and continue ribbing as set until band measures 2.5" [6.5 cm], ending after a Row 2 and inc 0(3, 3) sts evenly across across last rib row - 33(36, 40) sts.

Change to larger needles and beg with a k row, proceed to follow Right Front Graph, working design as before and keeping front 3 sts in Garter st (every row k), as set.**

Cast off and dec for armhole as indicated until 92(92, 94) rows have been completed.

To Shape Front Neck:

Next Row: Cast off first 4(4, 5) sts, k to end, dec for raglan as before.

Now continue to dec for raglan on every right side row as before, AND AT THE SAME TIME, dec one st at neck edge on every row 3(3, 5) times, then on every alternate row 2(3, 1) times.

Now continue to dec for raglan only until one st remains. Fasten off.

Left Front: Using smaller needles and Cream, cast on 33(33, 37) sts and work ribbing as follows:

Row 1: (right side) K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to last 3 sts, k3.

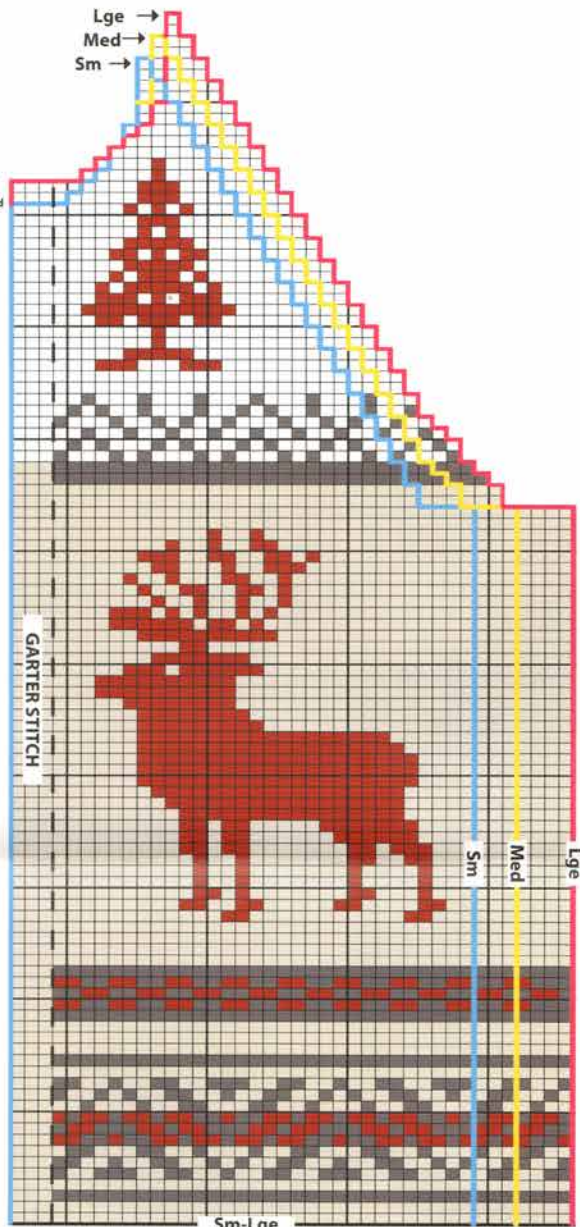
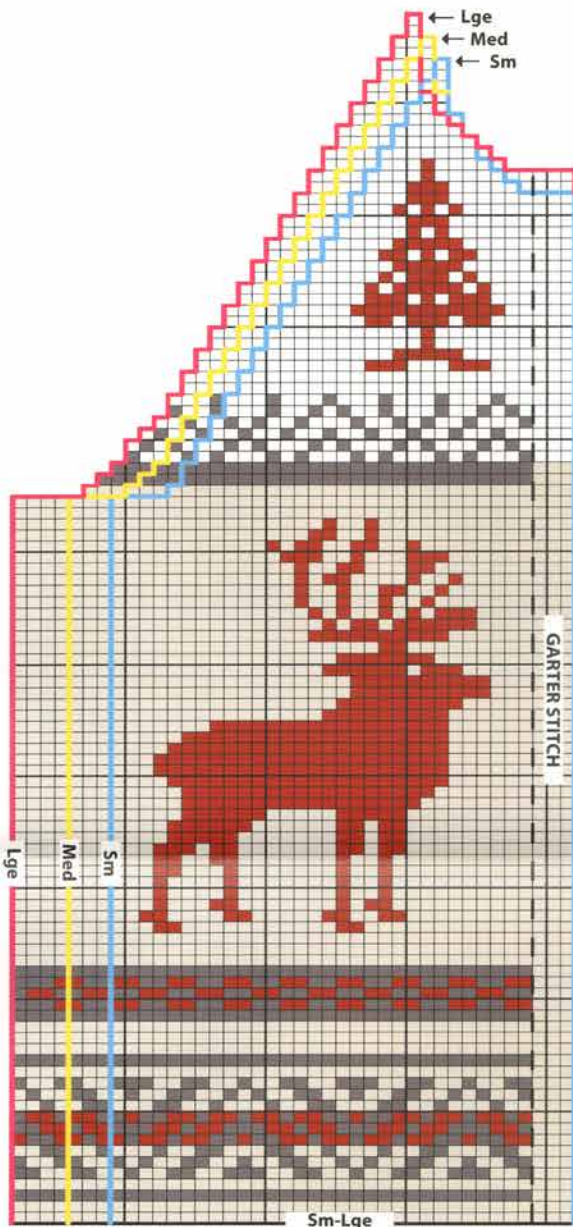
Row 2: K3, p2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end.

Now work as given for Right Front from ** to **, but following Left Front Graph.

Cast off and dec for armhole as indicated until 91(91, 93) rows have been completed.

To Shape Front Neck:

Next Row: Cast off first 4(5, 5) sts, p to end.



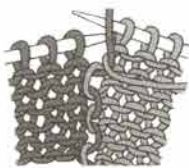
READ PURL ROWS FROM THIS SIDE

Colored Pattern Knitting: This method is used for large areas of each color and background, using small balls of color for each area. Work required number of sts, drop color in use to be picked up on next row, bring new color under and over last color, thus avoiding a hole in the knitting.

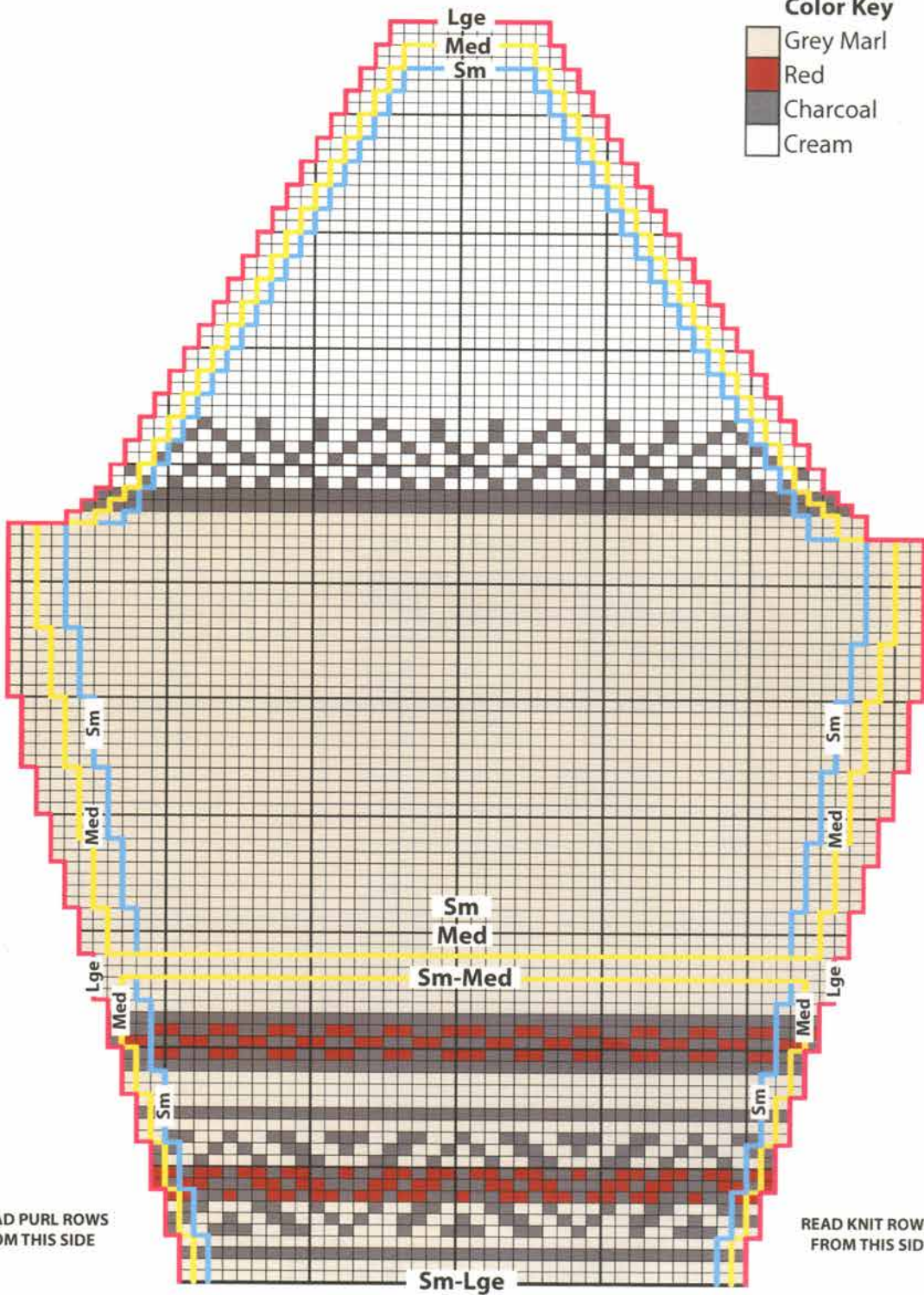


Fair Isle Stranding: This method is used when only a few stitches of 2 or more colors are worked at one time to make design. Colors not in use are carried or woven along on wrong side as follows: For Knit Rows: Color in use is held in right hand in normal way, color carried or woven at back is held taut over middle finger of left hand, knit st in normal way. Still holding color not in use over middle finger, insert needle in next st under color being carried, knit st allowing color being carried to slip off needle and pulling color in use through st onto right hand needle. For Purl Rows: Hold yarn in the same manner, working under one st and over next with color being carried.

NOTE: Instructions are given for the smallest size and remaining sizes are given in the brackets following. Where only one set of instructions are given, this will apply to all sizes. Every square on the graph represents a stitch. Changes in color are shown by different symbols. Follow graph from right to left for knit rows and left to right for purl rows. When graph shows an extra square, increase one stitch, one square less, decrease one stitch. Decreases of more than one stitch must be cast off or placed on a stitch holder as stated in pattern instructions. Stitches are either knit or purl as they are cast off, this will account for one row of squares. Ribbing is not included on the graph, but is explained in the instructions.

Now continue to dec for raglan on every right side row as before, AND AT THE SAME TIME, dec one st at neck edge on every row 3(3, 5) times, then on every alternate row 2(3, 1) times. Now continue to dec for raglan only until one st remains. Fasten off.

Sleeves: Using smaller needles and Cream, cast on 34(34, 38) sts and work in ribbing as follows:

Row 1: (right side) K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 2: P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end. Repeat these 2 rows once more.

Change to Red and rep Rows 1 and 2 once.

Change to Cream and continue in ribbing as set until band measures 2.5" [6.5 cm], ending after a Row 2 and inc 1(3, 1) sts evenly across last rib row - 35(37, 39) sts.

Change to larger needles and beg with a k row, proceed to follow Sleeve Graph, working design as before and inc as indicated.

Sizes Sm and Med only:

When 26 rows of graph have been completed, skip next 2 rows, then continue to work graph as indicated for size being worked.

Cast off and dec for top of sleeve.
Cast off on last row.

Sew all raglan seams.

Collar: Using larger needles and Cream, cast on 4(4, 5) sts.

Row 1: Knit.

Row 2: K1, kf&b, k 0(0, 1), kf&b, k1 - 6(6, 7) sts.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: K1, kf&b, k to last st, kf&b, k1 - 8(8, 9) sts.

Rows 5 and 6: As Rows 3 and 4 - 10(10, 11) sts.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 8: K2, kf&b (mark as outer edge), k to end.

Repeat these last 2 rows until there are 16(16, 18) sts on the needle.

Knit 3 rows.

Next Row: As Row 8 - 17(17, 19) sts.

Repeat these last 4 rows once more - 18(18, 20) sts.

Now work even in Garter st (every row k), until collar measures 9" [23 cm] from last inc worked, ending at outer edge.

Next Row: (outer edge) K2, k2tog, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

Knit 3 rows.

Repeat these last 4 rows once more - 16(16, 18) sts.

Next Row: K2, k2tog, k to end.

Next Row: Knit.

Repeat these last 2 rows until 10(10, 11) sts rem.

Next Row: K1, k2tog, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 - 8(8, 9) sts.

Next Row: Knit.

Repeat these last 2 rows once more - 6(6, 7) sts.

Next Row: K1, k2tog, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 - 4(4, 5) sts.

Cast off knitwise.

To Complete: Sew side and sleeve seams.

Sew collar in place, sewing cast on sts, inner edge and cast off sts of Collar to neck edge, beg and ending at front edges of jacket.

Lay jacket out flat and measure length of front edge from beg of neck shaping to bottom edge to determine length of zipper needed.

Pin zipper in place, centering between neck edge and cast on edge.

Sew in zipper, having teeth of zipper sitting along front edges. This will keep the zipper from showing when closed.
