



## Uromastyx Sp.

This mainly vegetarian lizard makes a wonderful pet. Uromastyx are among the most beautiful reptiles regularly available. Uromastyx are generally easy to care for as long as temperature requirements, which border on extreme, are met.

# Adult Size Life Span

10-24" depending on species. 15-20 years.

 Most Uromastyx in the pet trade are farmed in Africa, and benefit from a de-worming. It is highly recommended to have a fecal test done by a qualified exotics vet when acquiring a Uromastyx.

### <u>Habitat</u>

- Though Uromastyx are not among the largest lizards, they are very active and benefit from a minimum cage size of 36"x18"x18". Larger cages also allow for easier temperature control.
- Uromastyx come from a very hot dry area.

#### <u>Temperature</u>

- 84-88F Ambient temperature
- Basking spot 115-120F. Place a large flat rock under the basking lamp as the Uromastyx will bask on the rock and absorb heat from the rock.
- Achieving these temperatures sometimes requires the use of two heat lamps!

## <u>Lighting</u>

- UBB lighting is essential for Uromastyx well being.
- A 10.0% UVB bulb or a mercury vapor bulb should be on over the cage for approximately 12 hours per day.

#### Substrate

Uromastyx can be kept on a few different substrates. Finch seed
is used by some of the top breeders in the world as the
Uromastyx tend to eat the seeds. Many keepers also choose to
keep them on sand or even ceramic tiles.

#### Nutrition

- Uromastyx in the wild are omnivorous, although most people keep them as vegetarians in captivity.
- Most of their diet consists of high quality leafy greens, such as spring mix, collard or dandelion greens. Along with seeds (finch) and legumes (such as rehydrated lentils)
