Understanding Texts

- Build background knowledge with a rich book introduction. Ensure students
 know Diwali is the Festival of Lights, that it is a time to be with family, friends
 and a time to be good. Have them hear, locate and say the words Diwali and
 beginnings. Introduce them to some of the things that are done at Diwali such
 as buying new clothes, making snacks and sweet and gift giving. *UnT4, UnT5
- Show students the words in bold and locate them in the picture glossary. Tell
 them the purpose of the glossary. *UnT5
- After reading, make a list of the things that the children in the book do at Diwali. Talk about some of the things that students do with their family that are similar and when they do them e.g. new clothes at Easter; special snacks and sweets at their birthday. *UnT4

Phonic Knowledge and Word Recognition + Phonological Awareness

- Locate the words eating and playing. Notice the ing ending. Use magnetic
 letters to make the words then break the ing ending off. Add ing to other words
 from the book such as put, look and buy. *PKW5
- Locate the words time, make and game. Have students hear the long vowel sound and see the e on the end. Explain the rule. Find other CVCe words and read. *PKW5




