Understanding Texts

- Introduce the text by talking about camping and the activities typically done when camping. *UnT4, UnT5
- After reading, have students infer from the images and the text, some of the activities the children did on the camping trip. *UnT4, UnT5
- Have students draw a picture of themselves camping with their family and friends. *UnT4

Phonic Knowledge and Word Recognition + Phonological Awareness

- Locate the words camping and fishing. Use magnetic letters to make each word and notice the suffix ing. Break the ing off and read the base word. Repeat with other familiar words such as go, look and jump.

- Locate the words tents, chairs, beds and swimmers. Have students notice the s on the end that denotes plural. Make each word with magnetic letters and break the s off. Read each word. *PKW5
