Understanding Texts

- Demonstrate one to one correspondence including tapping multiple times for multisyllable words such as apple, banana and sandwich. *FIY1
- Ensure students read left to right, pointing crisply to each word. *FIY1
- After reading, have students talk about some of the things that were in the lunch. *UnT4, UnT5
- Have students notice the sandwich wrap and lunch bag. Tell students they can be used again and again. Discuss other things that can be recycled such as paper, bottles and cardboard boxes. *UnT4, UnT5

Vocabulary: treat, wrap

High Frequency Words: here, is, my

Phonic Knowledge and Word Recognition + Phonological Awareness

- Locate the word bag and make it with magnetic letters. Segment into individual sounds b-a-g then contract to read. Change the medial vowel to i and segment b-i-g then contract to read. Repeat with other vowels to make new words. *PKW3, PhA5
- Clap the words apple, banana and sandwich. Hear the syllables. Clap other familiar multisyllabic words students may know such as students' names. *PhA2
