Understanding Texts

- Before reading, discuss the places that the children are riding their bikes. Ensure students know the vocabulary track, park and river. *UnT4, UnT5
- Demonstrate one to one correspondence including tapping twice for the multisyllabic word river. *FIY1
- Ensure students read left to right, pointing crisply to each word. *FIY1
- After reading, talk with students about places they could ride their bikes. Record. *UnT4

Vocabulary: beach, park, river, track

High Frequency Words: can, my, to, the, with

Phonic Knowledge and Word Recognition + Phonological Awareness

- Make word strings with ride, for example hide, side and tide. Hear the rhyme and notice the pattern. Repeat with the words bike and track.

- Locate ride and bike. Notice the e on the end of the word and tell students that the e often makes the medial vowel say its name. Look at other familiar words that work the same way such as like, name and made. *PKW5
