# **Understanding Texts**

- Build background knowledge by discussing the things that plants need to grow - sun, soil and water. Ensure students understand the time it takes for a little tree to grow into a big tree. \*UnT4, UnT5
- After reading, have students recall what the tree needed to grow.

- Plant some seedlings in class. Watch them grow and write about how the seedlings change as they grow. \*UnT4

### Phonic Knowledge and Word Recognition + Phonological Awareness

- Locate the words look and little. Use these two words to prompt students to look carefully at visually similar words. Repeat with other visually similar high frequency words such as will and when, the and they and here and he. \*PKW5, PKW6
- Make a word string using tree such as free, see and three. Hear the rhyme and notice the pattern. \*PhA2, PKW6
