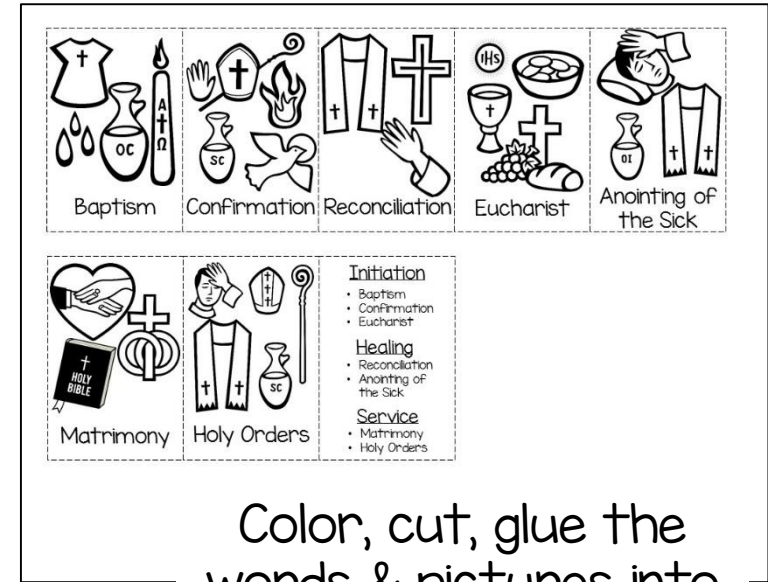
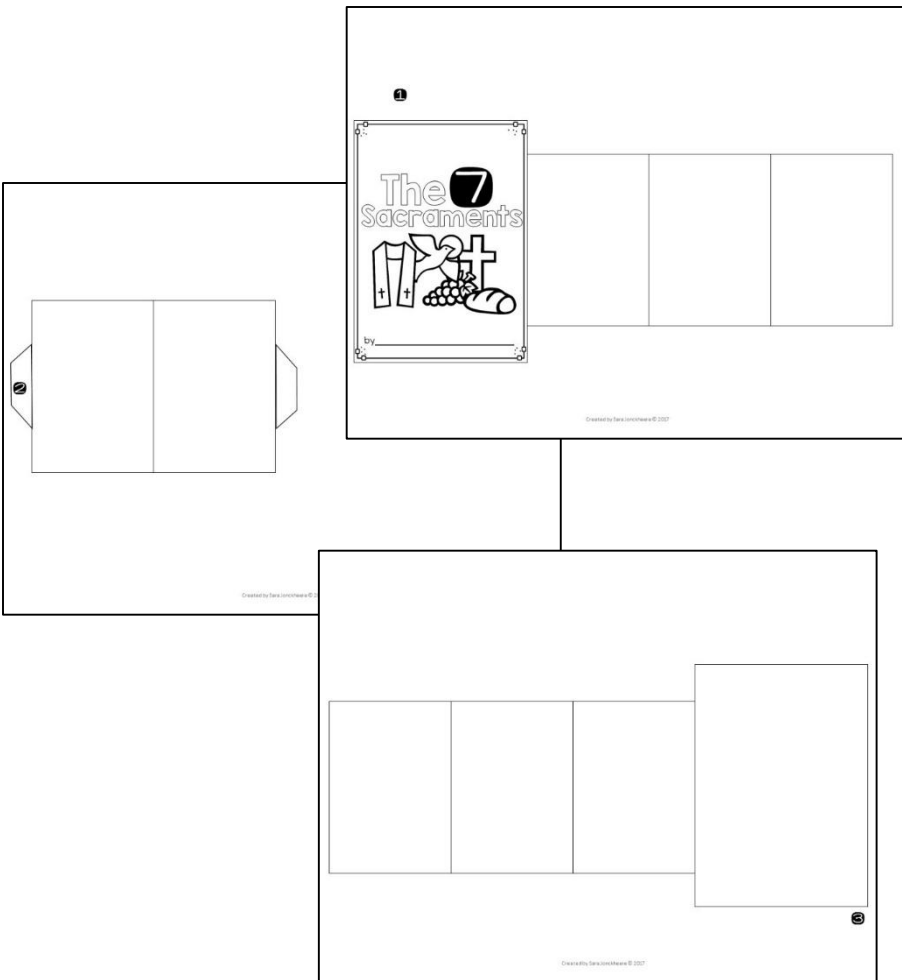
The 7 Sacraments

Additional Information

This information can be used to help explain the Seven Sacraments of the Catholic Church or give more information for older students to add to their mini books.

Sacraments of initiation	Baptism	Preparation for all other sacraments. Jesus was from the power of Original Sin, covered with God so you must say yes to it. parents speak on behalf of a baby, water poured three times over the head with holy oil. Together you are the one of the father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. water symbolizes cleansing and new life, administered by a priest, priest or deacon, become members of the Body of Christ. Uses oil of catechumen or holy oils in anointment, anointing with sacred chrism signifies the gift of the Holy Spirit to the newly baptized.
	Confirmation	Completes Baptism, gift of the Holy Spirit is bestowed on us under the signs of the laying of hands and anointing with oil. Sacrament of full and responsible membership in the Catholic Church, now the confirmands act out as a witness for Christ by their words and actions, makes a covenant with God, usually administered by a bishop.
	Eucharist	Jesus gives the Body and Blood For us so that we will give ourselves in love and be united with him in holy communion. Jesus instituted this sacrament at the Last Supper. Eucharist is the heart of the Christian communion. It transforms us into the Body of Christ. Christ acts in every celebration of the Eucharist - the bishop or priest receives the Eucharist (Christ) as if Christ acts through them, God is truly present in the consecrated species of bread and wine.
Sacraments of healing	Reconciliation	Also called Penance, sacrament of forgiveness, sacrament of conversion or sacrament of confession. This is a sign when we confess our sins with God and are forgiven because of human weakness and our sin. Jesus instituted this sacrament on Easter to his apostles. God is the only one who can forgive, priests forgive in Jesus' name because Jesus gave them the power to do that, under no circumstances can a priest "reset" what he hears in the confessional.
	Anointing of the Sick	Administered more than one time in your life. Is for any Catholic, unless healed in a critical state. Consists of anointing the forehead and hands with oil of anointment, prayer and words. can administer this sacrament, unless the sick person and their sufferings with Christ.
Sacraments of the service of communion and mission	Matrimony	A promise made by man and woman before God and the Church, because God forms the bond of matrimony with the death of one of the partners, priest or deacon can witness the marriage. 3 requirements include the consent, absence of any impediment and openness to children.
	Holy Orders	Man receives gift of the Holy Spirit that gives him the authority that Christ passes through the bishop, through the ordination he has the transforming and healing powers of Christ (from that moment) and is called to be a witness and to lead others to Christ. Jesus selected men to be the Last Supper for the institution of the priesthood.

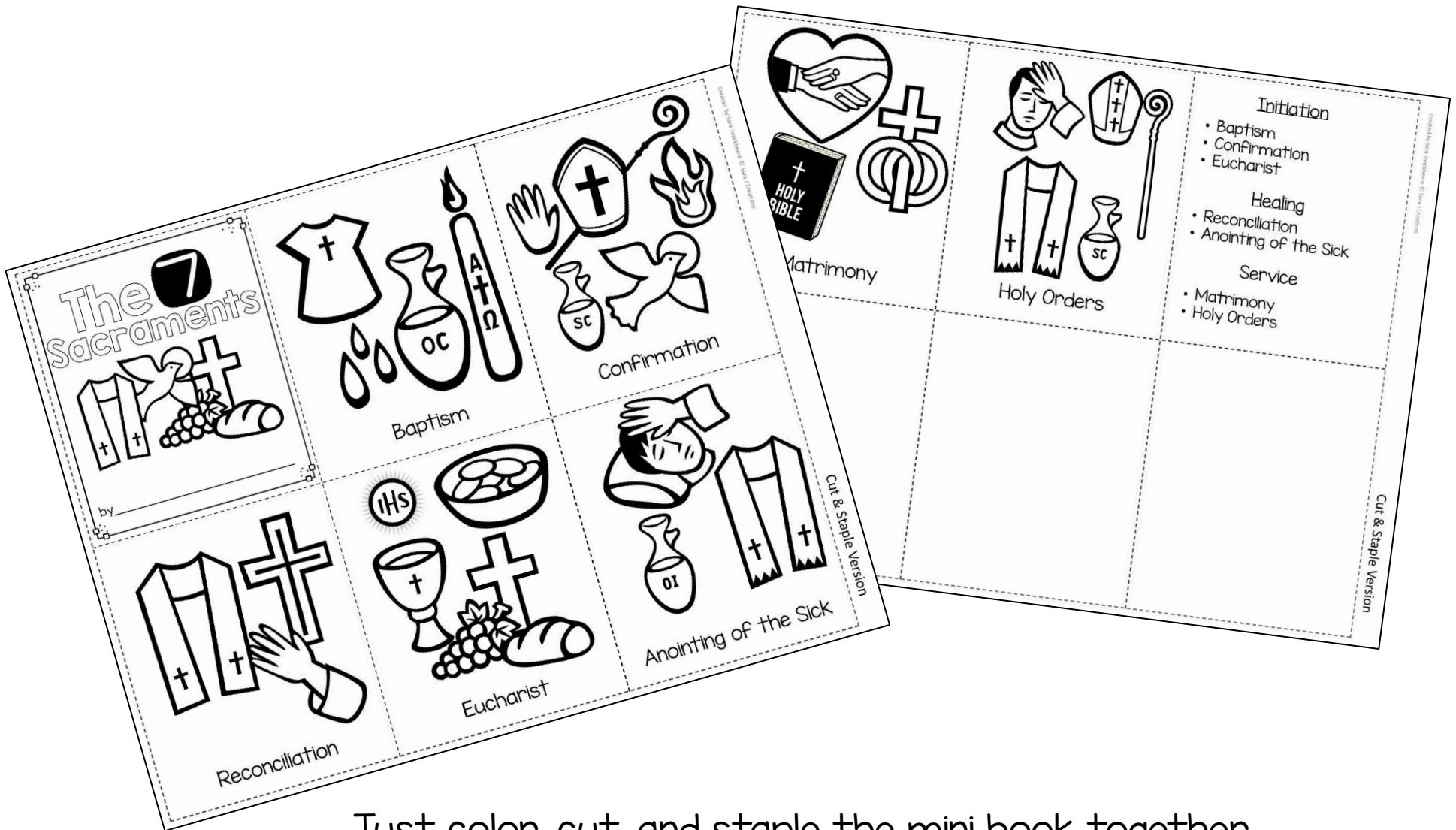

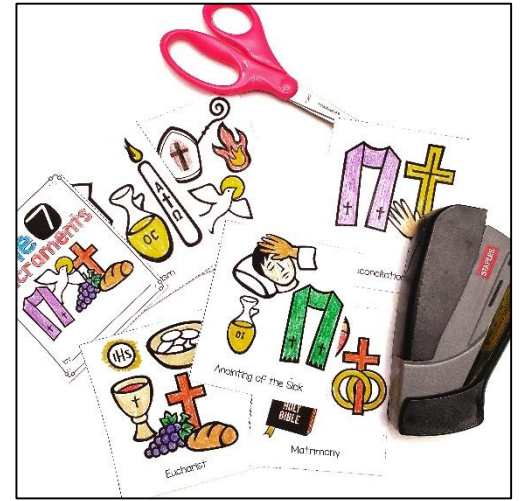
