SATURDAY SAMPLER

WEEK 2 * MAKE 5 BLOCKS
 FINISHED SIZE OF EACH BLOCK IS 4 ½" X 4 ½"

During our Saturday Sampler, beginning May 6, 2023, we will be releasing a NEW block or blocks, just for you to sew & stitch into a fabulous quilt when all blocks are completed! Print the free pattern online or stop in the shop to pick up each week's pattern! Please read the introductory information on separate page prior to beginning. There is important fabric requirement & cutting instructions.

FABRIC:

- 1 red print fabric
- 2 cream print fabrics
- 2 tan print fabrics

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

From red print:

- (4) 2 ⅞ X 2 ⅞ inch squares, then cut once on the diagonal

From cream print #1:

- (6) 2 ⅞ X 2 ⅞ inch squares

From cream print #2:

- (2) 3 3/16 X 3 3/16 inch squares, then cut twice on the diagonal (do the best you can with the 16th measurement!)

From tan print #1:

- (6) 2 ⅞ X 2 ⅞ inch squares

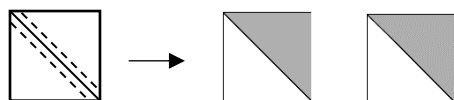
From tan print #2:

- (2) 3 3/16 X 3 3/16 inch squares, then cut twice on the diagonal

Seam allowances are always ¼" unless otherwise noted & fabrics are sewn right sides together.

SEWING INSTRUCTIONS:

1. To make the spinner block in cream & tan, begin by making half square triangle (hst)



units. Draw a diagonal line on the back of all cream print #1 – 2 ⅞" squares. Layer, right sides together, with the tan print #1 squares. Stitch ¼" on both sides of the drawn line; cut on the drawn line; press. Each hst unit measures 2 ½" square.

2. Arrange hst units into 3 blocks. Sew the hst units into pairs first, pressing each row opposite the next. Sew the pairs together to complete the blocks. Each block measures 4 ½" square.
3. To make the spinner blocks in cream, tan & red, refer to the block diagram on the right & sew the cream print #2 triangles to the tan print #2 triangles, which is marked with an arrow on the block diagram. Next sew one of these units to each red print triangle. Each unit measures 2 ½" square.
4. Arrange units from step 3 into 2 blocks. Sew the units in pairs first, pressing each row opposite the next. Sew the pairs together to complete the blocks. Each block measures 4 ½" square.
