RENOVATION AWARD -COMMERCIAL/OTHER 40,000 SF OR LESS

Pali Momi Medical Pavilion

ENTRANT Architects Hawaii Ltd.

DEVELOPER/OWNER: Hawaii'i Pacific Health
LEAD DESIGN FIRM: Architects Hawaii Ltd.

The challenge was to transform a former retail store into an outpatient medical clinic with a spa-like healing environment. Light was brought into the windowless space by creating an open circular staircase and a light well along with solar tubes. A sculptural waterfall symbolizes rebirth and rejuvenation.



RENOVATION AWARD -COMMERCIAL/OTHER OVER 40,000 SF

Six Eighty Ala Moana

This former office building was converted into a mixed-use building with 54 studio and one-bedroom apartments and 9,000 square feet of commercial space on the ground floor. Targeting the young professional market, the center provides appealing amenities such as a media room, lounge room for gatherings, and small rooftop recreation deck.

The Towers at Kuhio Park

Hawaii State Art Museum Sculpture Garden

The project vision was to create a usable, educational space in the existing unused pool area/courtyard. Art and architecture are integrated to flow seamlessly, discovering new aspects of the pieces like the morning sun casting patterns through Satoru Abe's copper railings and walking in the evening on Doug Young's Waikui water piece.



NONPROFIT PROJECT AWARD

Central Union Preschool & Kindergarten Phase 1

This is the first step of redevelopment for a school with an 80-plus-year history. The new campus has begun to emerge in forms that are playful and welcoming, but also pay homage to the historical lineage of the church. Integrated landscaping provides historical reference to 1931 foliage while enfolding the school in a garden-like environment.

St. Damien of Molokaʻi Church



The church is the first tilt-up, modern construction of its kind on Molokai. The project team overcame the challenges of working on an island of remote accessibility, on an extremely narrow building site in urban Kaunakakai, within a restrictive budget and timeframe to complete the new spiritual center long awaited by this close-knit community.
