
Thank you for your recent application for an off-licence. I am now pleased to advise you of its success and enclose the relevant documentation.

Off Licence (For Premises)

Sections 17 to 20, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012


PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **Delete NZ Limited** is authorised to sell alcohol remotely from the premises situated at 324 Tristram Street Hamilton Central 3204, and known as “**Delete NZ Limited**”, to any person for consumption off the premises.

CONDITIONS: This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Alcohol may be sold or supplied at any time, on any day, while always trading as a remote seller.
- (b) **Alcohol must not be delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day, or between 11:00pm and 6:00am the following day.**
- (c) The licensed premises is described in the plan date stamped as received by the Hamilton District Licensing Committee on 24 March 2021.
- (d) The Licensee must ensure all staff receives training in their responsibilities and obligations under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
- (e) The licensee must take reasonable steps to verify that the buyer (and if applicable, the receiver) is not under the purchase age. The licensee must ensure that the sale will not be made unless the buyer (and if applicable, the receiver) completes a declaration that they are 18 years of age or over on first entering the internet site and again immediately before the sale is completed.
- (f) The outside of the delivery package must contain the following words:
COURIER WARNING
 - a) **Do not leave at destination without proof of delivery.**
 - b) **Do not leave with persons under 18 years of age. If the receiver appears to be under the age of 25 years check valid identification such as current passport, driver licence or Hospitality NZ 18+ Card Evidence of Age Document to ensure the receiver is 18 years of age or over.**
 - c) **Do not leave with intoxicated persons.**
 - d) **Contains alcoholic product.**
- (g) A copy of the licence must be displayed on the Delete NZ Limited’s internet site in a prominent place.
- (h) Every receipt for the sale of alcohol by remote sale must contain the licence holder’s name, licence number and the date on which the licence expires.

The 15th day of June 2022

OR, until the close of the period in which this licence is subsequently renewed.

Any renewal of the licence must be filed at least 20 working days before the expiry of the latest issue/renewal date.
