




# HOW TO HANG THE SANTA ROSA HAMMOCK

---

Before the serious relaxing can begin, we've got a few pointers on how to get the most out of your hammock.

When you take your hammock out of the bag, check to make sure the fringe (A) is straight. It may have gotten a bit tangled on its way to you, so just keep looping the strands through the handle until you have it all straightened out. Once you've got it good to go, flip this card over for a few tips on how to hang your hammock.


# TAKING IT OUTSIDE

## STEP 1: SCOPE IT OUT

You'll need to find a pair of trees or posts spaced about 10 to 12 feet apart and 5 to 7 feet high so that the bed (B) of the hammock can hang at least 3 feet from the ground.

## STEP 2: HANG IT UP

Take the braided ropes (D) and thread the loop through the looped handle (C) on the hammock. Then form a knot by taking the loose ends of the braided ropes (D) and threading them through the loop of the braided rope (D). Take the two separate loose ends of the braided rope and tie them around the tree or the post.



# KEEPING IT INSIDE

Before you get started, make sure you have a measuring tape, a stud locator, a power drill, and two eye bolts, hooks, or other fasteners.

## STEP 1: MAP IT OUT

If you want to hang your hammock inside, we recommend anchoring the hammock in a wall stud, so keep the wall stud location in mind when marking your anchor points.

To mark your anchor points, determine how wide and high you want your hammock. The closer you put your anchor points, the higher you will need to hang the hammock. We've included a range of the hanging options below:

Range of Width (between anchor points) .....	9 ft – 12 ft
Range of Height (from anchor points to ground) .....	5 ft – 7 ft
Distance of Bed from Ground .....	2 ft – 3 ft

## STEP 2: SECURE IT IN PLACE

Once you've marked your anchor points and located the wall studs, drill in the holes and secure an eye bolt or hook into each hole. Then attach the hammock by knotting the looped braided ropes (D) (see above directions) or fastening with a carabiner.
