## HOW TO HANG

YOUR MIRROR

> Your package includes the mirror with attached French cleats, screws, anchors, and the wall portion of the French cleats. To hang this beauty, you will also need to grab a drill, hammer, ruler, pencil, and level (extra hands will also be helpful!).

> Your mirror can be hung vertically or horizontally depending on your space.

## STEP 1: FIND THE BEST SPOT

Hold the mirror where you want to hang it and make a mark on the wall at the top center of the mirror pressing down against the frame.

## STEP 2: MEASURE UP

Set the mirror down and measure vertically down from the mark using a ruler 13.5 cm if hanging vertically, 20.5 cm if hanging horizontally) and make another mark on the wall. If hanging horizontally, you won't be drilling either of these marks - they are for spacing purposes only. If hanging vertically, you'll be drilling the lower mark later on.

## STEP 3: MARK IT

Measure and mark two new points to either side of the lower mark ( 17 cm to each side if hanging vertically, 9.5 cm to each side if hanging horizontally). Use a level to make sure they're in line. Hold the wall portion of the French cleat to this line. You should see your markings in the center of each hole (if they're slightly off, re-mark in the right spot). If hanging horizontally, mark the outermost two holes while holding the wall portion of the cleat against the wall.


## STEP 4: SECURE THE ANCHORS

Drill holes (at 90 degrees) on those marks with a 1/4" drill bit. Press anchors into holes and lightly tap in with a hammer if needed.

## STEP 5: MOUNT THE FRENCH CLEAT

Have your friend hold up the French cleat (ensure it is oriented so that the mirror portion of the cleat can slide into the wall portion, with the open edge facing up) while you drill the screws into each anchor.

## STEP 6: HANG IT UP

Place the mirror on the wall interlocking the two French cleats. And there you go!

## TAKING CARE OF YOUR MIRROR

The frame surrounding your mirror is made of natural hinoki cypress wood. We recommend installing the piece out of direct sunlight, though some natural darkening of the wood will occur over time which we think adds to its beauty.

To keep your mirror looking its best, use a clean, dry microfiber cloth to dust.
