supplies:

- (5) Club Scrap® Pizza Boxes
- (2) 12x12 Papers
- Printed Twill • (8) Brads
- 2x18" CS® Grid Ruler
- CS® Bookbinding Glue • Foam Brush
- Sharp Utility Knife • Cutting Mat
- Scoring Tool (Optional)
- Scissors • Pencil
- Crop-A-Dile or Paper Piercing Tool



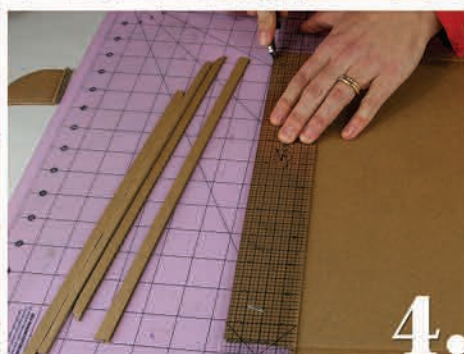

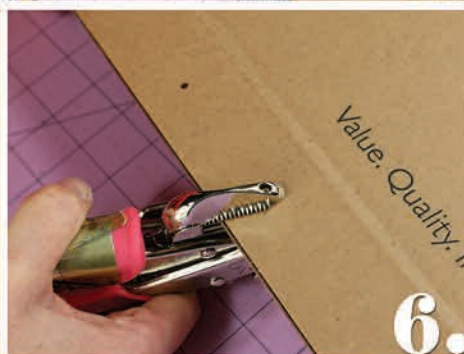
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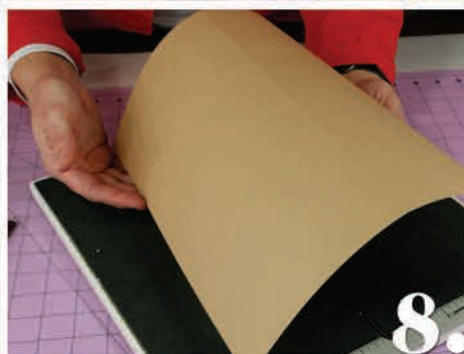

one: Use a utility knife to cut along the back corners of the box, starting at the base, so the lid will lay flat on your work surface.

two: Cut along the back bottom score of the box to completely remove the lid and the back wall.

three: Slide out the tabs from side walls.

four: Using a grid ruler and utility knife, remove about 1/4" from the top of each side wall on the lid. For best results, use the grid ruler to measure 1-3/4" from the score lines. Remove the outside tabs of the lid, as well.

five: Place the prepared box lid right side up on your work surface and use the ruler to find the center of the front wall. Measure and mark 1.25" to the left and right of the center.

six: Punch marked holes with a Crop-A-Dile or pierce with a piercing tool.

seven: Trim printed twill into sections as indicated by the "cherished memories" text. The piece will measure approximately 3-1/2". Attach the twill to the lid wall with brads. The text on the twill should be positioned upside down, as the lid will now become the "tray" in the cabinet. Repeat steps 1-7 with a total of four boxes.

eight: With the grain direction running left to right, score each 12x12" paper at 6".

nine: Place paper into the trimmer with the score positioned horizontally. Trim at 10.5, 9, 7.5, 6, 4.5, 3 and 1.5". Repeat for the second sheet to yield a total of eight paper hinges.

ten: Fold each hinge in half on score line.

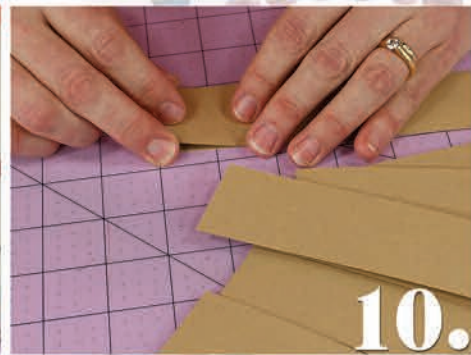
eleven: Protect your work surface, and brush glue onto one paper hinge. Attach the hinge to the inner side walls of the box lid to form the tray, placing the fold of the hinge into the corner of the tray. Repeat for all four corners. Use binder clips or clamps if needed to hold the walls up until the glue dries.

twelve: Brush a thin layer of glue onto the top edges of a box base and stack a second box onto the glued area, using firm downward pressure for a few moments while the glue bonds. Repeat until you have a stack of four boxes and four trays.

thirteen: Use the fifth box for the lid of the unit. Open box and use utility knife to remove front wall and tabs from the top lid.

fourteen: Cut down corners on the box front and remove front wall of box base.

fifteen: Close the box lid and glue to the top of the stack of prepared boxes. Load the trays with supplies and insert into the bottom four openings. Use the top portion for additional storage and lift box lid to access.

one: Use the side of the pencil lead to fill in a band of color.

two: Blend with a water brush or moist paint brush and add a stamped image.

three: Splatter the finished piece by transferring color from the tip of the pencil with a wet brush.
