Materials

- (3) 5½x8½" Gray Card Bases
- (3) 4x5¼" Ivory Card Panels
- (3) A2 Envelopes

Tools and Supplies

- Bouquet Rubber Stamps
- CS® Permanent Jet Black Ink Pad
- CS® Parchment Pigment Ink Pad
- Acrylic Stamping Block
- Whisper Chalk Paint

- Foam Brush
- Stamp Cleaner and Cloth
- Masking Tape
- Non-stick Craft Surface
- Adhesive
- Bone Folder
- Scrap Paper
- Scor-Pal (Optional)
- CS® Grid Ruler (Optional)
- Black Fine Tip Pen (Optional)

Notes Before Beginning

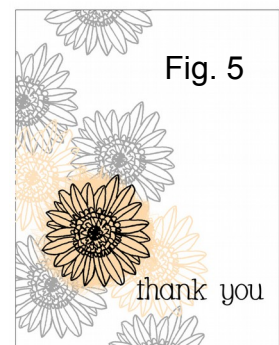
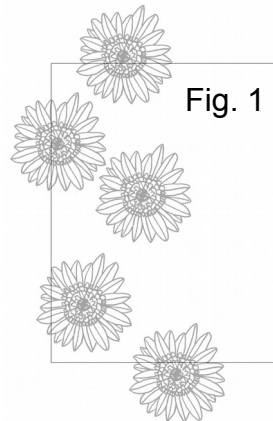
This technique requires stamps to be cleaned thoroughly after each use. Have cleaning supplies on hand before beginning technique.

Preparation

Fold each 5½x8½" Gray Card Base horizontally in half to make three 4¼x5½" greeting cards. Set two cards aside.

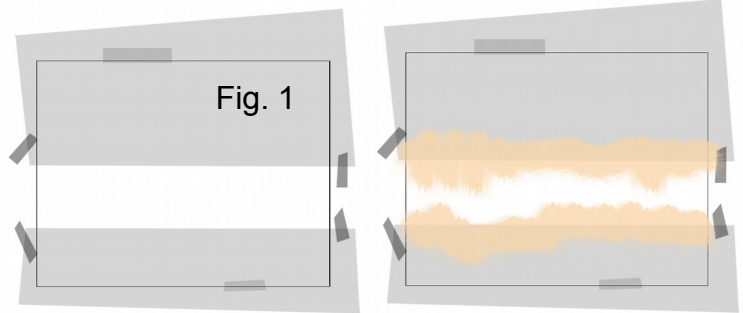
Shadow Masked Daisy Card

1. Ink daisy flower image with Permanent Jet Black ink. Stamp once lightly onto scrap paper to remove some ink. Stamp lighter image onto vertical card base toward top left. Repeat several more times, stamping randomly onto the left vertical side of the card base. *Clean stamp between each step.* (Fig. 1)
2. Stamp the daisy flower image twice with Parchment Ink as accent images. (Fig. 2)
3. Stamp the daisy flower image with Parchment ink prominently onto the lower-mid left of the card base to create a paint masking template. (Fig. 3)
4. Brush Whisper Chalk Paint into and around the Parchment ink stamped (template) area with a foam brush. The paint mask should be slightly larger than the stamped area. Let dry. (Fig. 4)
5. Stamp daisy flower image onto the masked area with Jet Black ink. Stamp the "thank you" sentiment to the lower right of the daisy with Jet Black ink. Adhere the Ivory panel to the inside of the card. (Fig. 5)



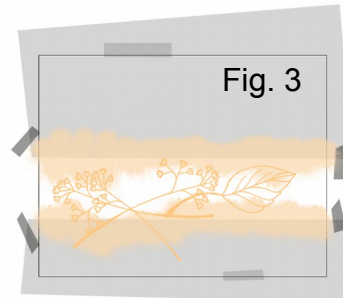
Double Masked Poppy Card

1. Lightly stabilize horizontal card base on work surface with masking tape. Create 1½x5½” horizontal masked area on a horizontal card base with scrap paper and masking tape. (Fig. 1)

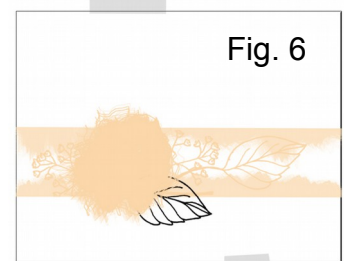
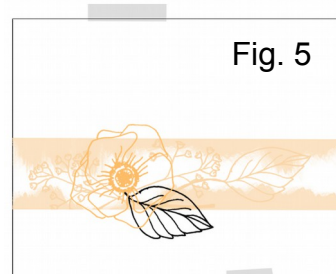


2. Brush Whisper Chalk Paint lightly into masked area. Heavier on masked edges, lighter in center of masked area. Let dry. (Fig. 2)

3. Stamp tall and short baby's breath images and large leaf image with Parchment ink within masked area. Special note: Ink only the leaf and not the stem. Carefully remove masking. (Fig. 3)



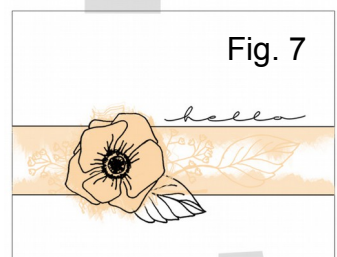
4. Stamp leaf image with Jet Black ink. (Only ink the leaf portion, not the stem.) (Fig. 4)



5. Stamp poppy flower image with Parchment ink to create paint masking template. (Fig. 5)

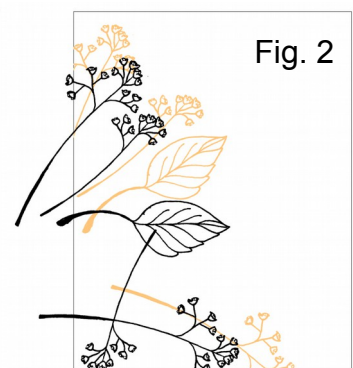
6. Brush Whisper Chalk Paint into and around the Parchment-stamped template area with a foam brush. Create a paint mask slightly larger than the stamped area. Let dry. (Fig. 6)

7. Stamp poppy flower image onto the masked area with Jet Black ink. Stamp the sentiment with Jet Black ink. Further embellish with a black pen as desired to finish. Adhere an Ivory panel to the inside of the card. (Fig. 7)



Bouquet Masking Card

1. Stamp the tall and short baby's breath images, and large leaf image onto a vertical card base with Parchment ink. (Fig. 1)
2. Stamp the same images onto the card with Jet Black ink. (Fig. 2)



3. Stamp the star flower cluster image with Parchment ink to create a paint masking template. (Fig. 3)
4. Brush Whisper Chalk Paint onto the Parchment stamped template area with a foam brush. Make the mask slightly larger than the stamped area. Let dry. (Fig. 4)
5. Stamp the star flower cluster image over the masked area with Jet Black ink. (Fig. 5)
6. Stamp the poppy and daisy flower images with Parchment ink. (Fig. 6)
7. Brush Whisper Chalk paint onto the newly-stamped template area. (Fig. 7)
8. Stamp the poppy and daisy onto the masked area with Jet Black ink. (Fig. 8)
9. Stamp the rose image with Parchment ink, paint the mask with Whisper Chalk. (Fig. 9-10)
10. Stamp the rose and sentiment with Jet Black ink. Further embellish, if desired, and adhere the Ivory panel to the inside of the card. (Fig. 11)
