

Brown Beech (buna shimeji) and Elm Oyster

Hypsizygus tessulatus & *H. ulmarius*



Traits: caps up to 12 / 20 cm in diam, brown or white (bunapi shimeji) ; gills cream-pinkish ; stem up to 3 cm, bent, withish; fleshy, mild odor; white spores

When: abundant July → Nov.

Where: on trunk of alive or dead deciduous, maple, poplar, birch, beech, elm, willow

Note: confusion one with the other, with oyster (shorter stem) and fried chicken mushroom (on the ground) ; extensively cultivated
