- Sewing for Jobs can give women who feel isolated a sense of both community and selfsufficiency in their own lives
- 87% of Sewing for Jobs alumni reported an increased hope score.
- In addition to Sewing for Jobs, EcoEquitable also houses public sewing classes, a recycled fabric boutique staffed by volunteers and Sewing for Jobs students, as well as an inhousean bag and accessory line that uses recycled provincial banners (*Flagbearer*).
