




I'm Bear and these are my friends!

Let's explore together and learn some new things along the way!




















School Days

Design a cake.


Make your own pin the tail game and play it with friends or family.


Can you see who is playing pin the tail at Bunny's birthday?

Create your own drawing of an underground home with lots of different underground rooms.










Design your dream cake in the space above!

Document them by drawing or taking photographs of them and try to identify them.






















Bear's Picnic

If you prefer to stay indoors, choose two raindrops near the top of the window and see which one wins the race down the windowpane.




Art Class

Write a programme for all the activities and refreshments you would have at a winter feast.




Goodnight World

Ice Art

Materials Required

Freezer safe bowls
Salt
Water colours or food colouring
Dropper or spoon

Method

- 1. Make the ice in the bowls, freezing overnight.
- 2. Using warm water, loosen the ice and place the domes on the tray.
- 3. Sprinkle a small amount of salt over the domes. What do you notice?
- 4. Using a dropper or spoon, drip water colour or food colouring onto the ice. What happens?







Ice Art

Materials Required

Tray of water (make sure it can go in the freezer)

Water colour paints

Paintbrush

Felt tip pens

Plain paper

Kitchen paper towel

Method

- 1. Freeze a tray of water to create a sheet of ice.
- 2. Paint on the surface of the ice.
- 3. Place the paper on top and press gently down all over to create a print.
- 4. Leave the paper to dry.
- 5. Add detail to the print with felt tips.

 Nb. You can wipe the ice down with a paper towel and then start again to create another print.
