Scheurebe [shoi-reeba] is a crossing of Riesling and Sylvaner Musqué, and hardly any is planted in the US. Joe fell in love with the Scheurebe of Hans Wirsching from the Franconia region of Germany. Dreamy/beachy/citrusy nose — honeyed blood orange / zippy red fruit / black currant.

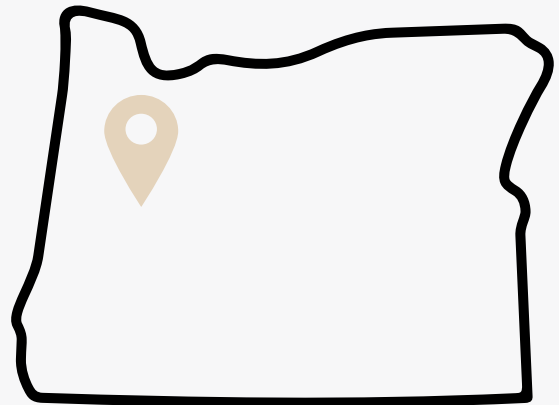

The Scheurebe enjoyed 45 days of skin contact, was then worked twice a day, plunged or foot stomped, before being pressed and aged in neutral French oak barrels. So₂ at racking. Blended in tank then allowed to settle before bottling.



Established in 2021, Lower Long Tom AVA is the most recent addition to the Oregon AVAs. Clay loam soils, prevailing winds and reduced precipitation create a microclimate that allows for a more consistent growing season. Planted in 1984 by German-born Dieter Boehm, High Pass Vineyard is 23 acres of vines: predominately Pinot Noir but with other mostly Germanic varieties such as Pinot Gris, Riesling, Scheurebe and Huxelrebe. The vineyard is characterized by silty clay soils over a bed of standstone. Boehm utilizes sustainable farming practices such as cover crops for weed suppression and to prevent soil erosion, utilizing birds for pest control, and composting of grape must for fertilizer.
