SUPPLY LIST FOR BASIC MACHINE APPLIQUE CLASS

- Sewing machine in good working order with a blanket stitch.
- A foot that can accommodate the blanket stitch. <u>Bernina 20, 20C, 20D</u> work best. It must be an open-toe foot so you can see your stitches.
- 1/4" foot for piecing the borders
- Stitch plate that can allow room for the width of the blanket stitch. A 5mm or 9mm plate is best
- Quilters World magazine Bright and Colorful Quilts Late Spring 2024 or <u>the Sunflower</u> Morning Table Runner kit.
- Materials indicated in the pattern on page 59 if purchasing magazine only. If you are purchasing the kit, you will have everything you need except the one yard of paper backed fusible web.
- Scrap fabric for practice. I will provide templates for you to trace, but you will need about ½ yard fusible web, ½ yard background fabric and ½ yard fabric to cut into appliqué pieces and fuse to the background. This is in addition to what you need for the project. Bring more if you think you will want to practice more. The fabric for appliqué pieces should contrast well with your background. You should also have scrap fabric to practice the blanket stitch.
- Thread and matching bobbin that contrasts with your background and appliqué fabric for the first day practice so that you can clearly see your appliqué stitches.
- When we start working on the actual project, you will need coordinating thread to match each fabric and a fully wound bobbin to match each thread color.
- Neutral thread and full bobbin for piecing
- Paper scissors and fabric scissors
- Small snips
- Pins
- Sewing needle
- Quilters ruler at least 14" long
- 3 or 4 sharp pencils with erasers
- Rotary cutter
- Some kind of container to hold your appliqué pieces.

Optional:

- Portable iron and pressing mat we will be doing a lot of fusing so there will be much use of the shop irons
- Single-hole stitch plate for piecing the border

In preparation for the first class, please do the following:

- Insert a new needle
- Clean and oil your machine
- Be sure you know your machine and how to access the blanket stitch
