

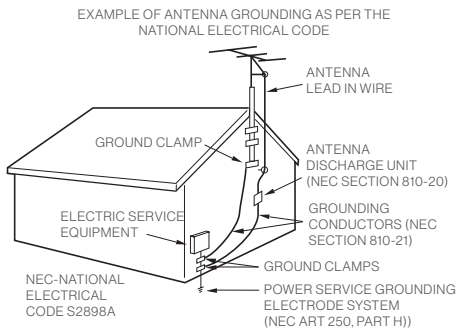

CONDENSATION

Moisture will form in the operating section of the unit if the unit is brought from cool surroundings into a warm room or if the temperature of the room rises suddenly. When this happens the unit's performance will be impaired. To prevent this, let the unit stand in its new surroundings for about an hour before switching on, or make sure the room temperature rises gradually.

Condensation may also form during the summer if the unit is exposed to the breeze from an air conditioner. In such cases, change the location of the unit.

HOW TO HANDLE THE LCD PANEL

- Do not press hard or jolt the LCD panel. It may cause the LCD panel glass to break and injury may occur.
- If the LCD panel is broken, make absolutely sure you do not touch the liquid in the panel. This may cause skin inflammation.

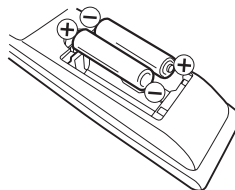
PREPARATION OF REMOTE CONTROL

Battery Installation

1. Open battery compartment cover.



2. Install two AAA batteries.



3. Close the cover of the battery compartment.

NOTE: Use two “AAA” size batteries. The batteries may last approximately one year depending on how much the remote control is used. For best performance, it is recommended that batteries should be replaced on a yearly basis, or when the remote operation becomes erratic. Do not mix old and new batteries or different types.

Battery Precautions

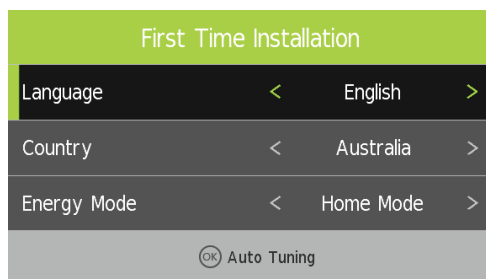
These precautions should be followed when using batteries in this device:

- Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
- Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the batteries as indicated in the battery compartment. Reversed batteries may cause damage to the device.
- Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.
- If the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer’s directions.)
- Please use caution when inserting batteries to avoid battery damage. If the spring terminal in the remote control remains in contact with a side of a damaged battery it can cause a short circuit. Never use damaged batteries as they can become very hot and are dangerous.

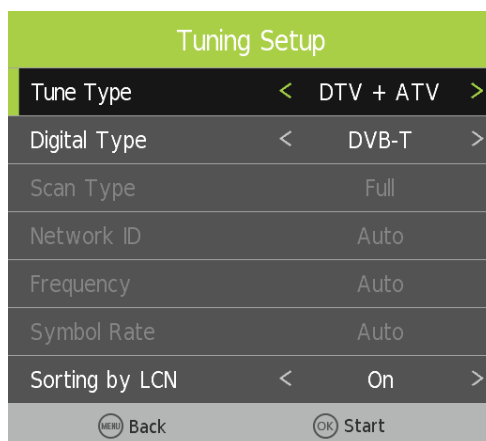
GETTING STARTED

The **First Time Installation** window appears the first time you turn on the TV. It will assist you to configure the TV.

1. Switch the **—/O** button at the bottom of the TV to **—** position to turn on the TV.
2. Press **⏻** button on the TV control panel or on the remote control to switch on the TV. The power indicator will change to blue. The **First Time Installation** window appears on the screen.
NOTE: It may take a few seconds before the **First Time Installation** window appears on the screen.
3. Use **▲** or **▼** to highlight the option you would like to reset.
4. Use **◀** or **▶** to select submenu. Press **OK** to start to search channels under selected mode. Or press **MENU** on the remote control to exit channel scan.

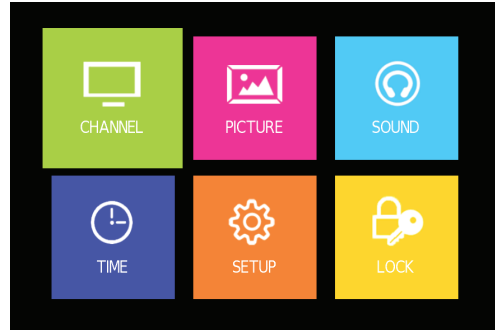
