In this month's note, I want to tell you about Polly Roberts, an incredible woman and long-time supporter of All As One, who passed away in September, leaving behind a legacy of great work and generosity.

Mary "Polly" Nooter Roberts was an art historian and museum professional, and was one of the world's foremost scholars in African arts. She was Professor of World Arts and Cultures at UCLA, and was awarded the lifetime Leadership Award of the Arts Council of the African Studies Association in 2017 — the most significant recognition in the academic field of African art studies. Brett Steele, Dean of the UCLA School of the Arts and Architecture, writes, "Polly brightened so many of our lives with her brilliant mind, luminous spirit, unyielding optimism and boundless generosity."

Polly's husband, Al Roberts, tells us:
