Opened in 1839, Green Mount is an early example of an urban/rural cemetery, a cemetery with a park-like setting located close to the countryside. It is located at **Greenmount Avenue and East Oliver Street, 3 blocks south of North Avenue**. Included in the tour will be some of the symbols used on the burial monuments, several bronze monuments, and graves of many historically significant people. Green Mount is the final resting place of Johns Hopkins, Enoch Pratt, William and

Henry Walters, the Garrett family, Elizabeth Patterson Bonaparte, Arunah S. Abell, Gov. Albert Ritchie, sculptor William Henry Rinehart, members of the Latrobe & Marburg families, Isaac Emerson, and many other famous Marylanders. Tim Fabiszak, an RI member and regular Baltimore Heritage guide, will lead the twohour walking tour, which begins promptly at 10 AM, from inside the main gate. You will be directed to parking inside the cemetery grounds. Please arrive by 9:45, to sign in. Green Mount requires visitors to sign a liability release form. Recommended: Bring a drink, wear comfortable shoes, a hat, and sunglasses. You must be able to stand and walk for 2 hours, on uneven paths, hills, over grass. There is only one bathroom, in the entrance gate building.
