## Be Prepared to Leave with Your Pet

A natural disaster is a stressful event for pets and people. A little preplanning, such as knowing where you will go if evacuated, can help enormously. Having supplies from home makes uprooting much easier on your pet, so pack a grab bag with pet care essentials. Kennels and emergency shelters may require vaccine history for your pets. We store our records online and can operate our office remotely, from anywhere. But if your veterinarian isn't cloud-based, ask them to email you a copy of your pet's prescription and vaccine history ahead of time, so you can access records when you need them. Finally, take your pets with you on the first notice to evacuate: if you leave the house, you may not be allowed to go back for them.

### IDENTIFICATION

Make sure your pet is microchipped and registered. Store a current photo online.

### PREPLAN HOUSING

Make a contact list of close pet-friendly friends and hotels. Email it to yourself.

### MEDICAL RECORDS

Ensure you can access a copy of your pet's prescriptions and vaccine history.
