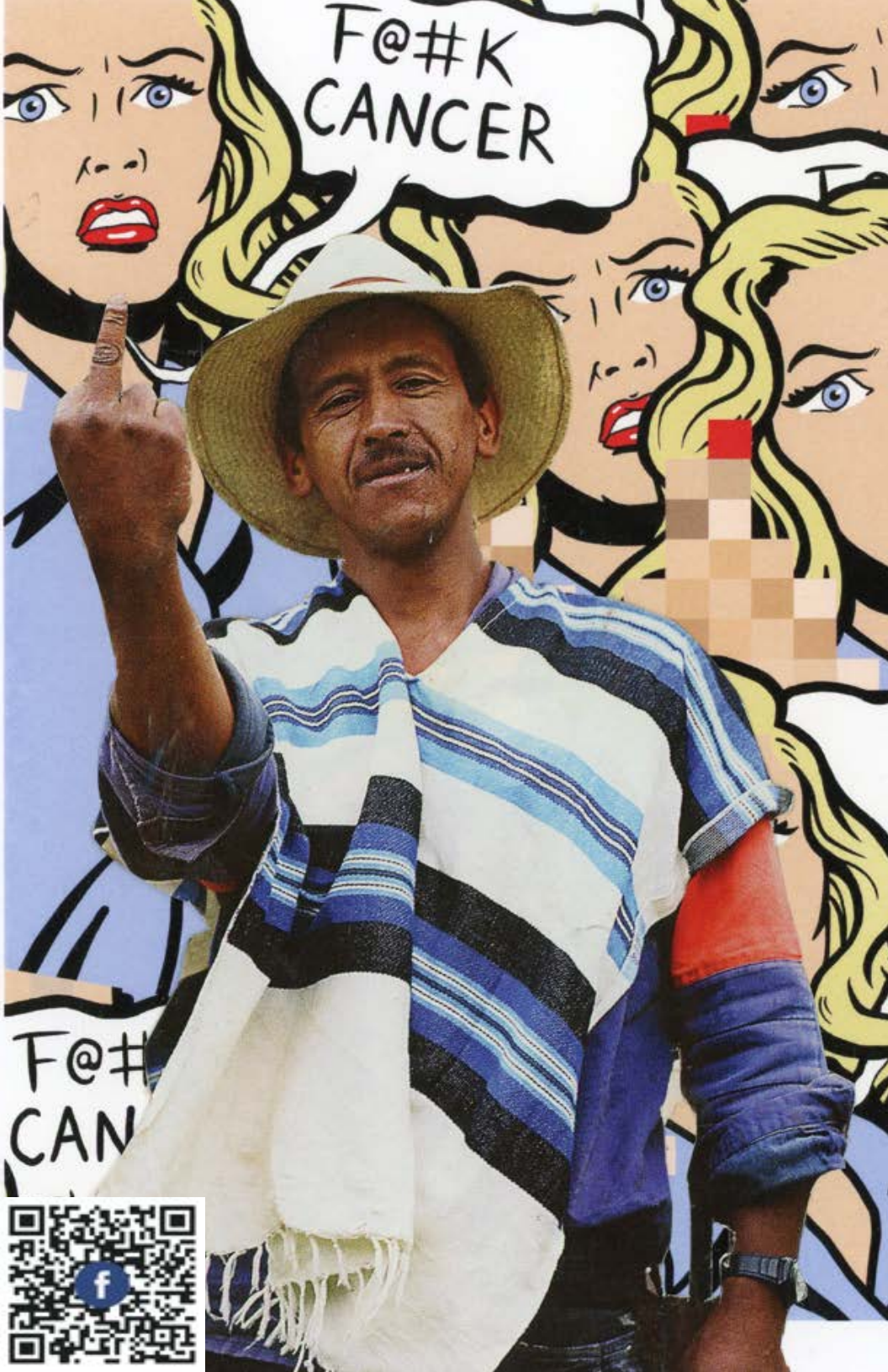

I'm 27 and diagnosed with mixed germ cell cancer all around my chest, lungs, and heart last year. Not terminal yet, but a high chance of getting there soon. All of the surgeries and chemo have not gotten rid of it. It is wrapped around my heart now. Some theories I've placed to my heart and last option. It has less than a 50% chance of working due to the size of cancer and the location. If it doesn't work, there's nothing more to really try. I'll have probably a few years left depending on how fast it grows and if I decide to take any of the venous virus chemo to buy another year or so.

I am still on massive amounts of medications for pain from it and the surgeries. I can't be any more aggressive because the chemo destroys your body. That really sucks because I was just starting to get a lot more active. I can't think well anymore because the chemo destroys your brain. It sucks, but many people are worse off in life. I've also had a pretty good and adrenaline filled life thus far so I'm rather accepting of death if it comes.

Right now it is hitting me hard because I have to get up or lie in the back narrow transplant in the next week. There are a ton of decisions to go through with the transplant, not to mention how sick I will be. No idea what I'm going to decide yet.

I have terminal cancer, and will be flying out to Switzerland to organise my affairs with Dignitas AMAA.

I am twenty-three years of age, and tomorrow I will be flying out to Switzerland to start the four month process of being assisted in suicide. I have chosen Dignitas to help me end my life, and I thought I would answer some questions from Reddit. I have terminal lung, and bronchial cancer, and my quality of life, and the amount of medication I need to take to live some form of normality is no longer worth it to me. I have posted proof to the moderators, and have chosen to remain anonymous as assisted suicide is not legal in my country, and there is no form of protection which would stop my family members being charged with assisting my suicide.

Edit: I am sorry I am back from Switzerland now, and it was a rather emotional journey so was not up to answering questions.

Price Dignitas, have invoiced me \$11,000 for the both the preparation, the assistance in suicide, and dealing with medical costs, and other requirements.
