Martha Gleeson & Pat Gleeson | Basketball

artha Gleeson and Pat Gleeson are known as Milton's basketball "birth parents". Long before the NBA came north of the border and before the Raptors became Canada's sweetheart team, the Gleesons identified a void when it came to basketball in town. There were no instructional programs. There were no leagues. It was high school-level basketball or nothing.

Determined to change the narrative, Martha and Pat started a program involving the local YMCA, before branching out and creating what became known as Monarch Basketball. Through dedication and resolve Martha and Pat's comprehensive Monarch program offered year-round options, such as: instructional camps, house league competition, summer camps, travel teams and high school coaching.

Martha and Pat witnessed the successes of the Monarch program for over two decades as their legacy grew year by year. There were championships and player awards, but the culmination may have come in 1997 when the Toronto Raptors recognized Martha for her coaching achievements. But in the end, it was the intangibles that were instilled in their young pupils that Martha and Pat could be most proud of: self-esteem, belonging, teamwork, striving for a goal, and building a sense of pride in one's community.

Bill Rowney | Ice Hockey

Bill Rowney has been involved in minor hockey for over 60 years in Milton. He is recognized as the ultimate hockey volunteer, with an allencompassing passion and dedication that has manifested itself in many ways.

For over 40 years, Bill held the position of Ontario Minor Hockey Association (OMHA) secretary. But his dedication

to the Town wasn't limited just to hockey. He also sat on the Milton Hydro Board for an unbelievable 44 years.

His hockey leadership includes managing the Milton Legion Bantam Hockey Club for nine years, with multiple Tri-County Championships secured, as well as leading the OMHA as District Convenor for the Tri-County Area. Bill was also president of the Tri-County Minor Hockey Association for two years.

Bill was the tournament director of the Tri-County Juvenile Tournament in the late 1960's – a highly successful annual Easter weekend competition of 500 players from 36 towns. The tournament was a fundraiser for the 1959 Listowel Arena collapse disaster fund. There were teams from across the province and across the border suiting up in Milton. Even with all of that success, Bill was always quick to identify areas for improvement and follow through the next year on those perfections.

Additionally, Bill has held the position of President of Milton Minor Hockey from 1967-69. In 1972, Bill received the Jim Brockle Memorial Trophy for his service to the 95-team Tri-County League.





Darlene Kranstz | Martial Arts (Jiu-Jitsu)

arlene Kranstz is an 8th-degree black belt in Jiu-Jitsu and she brings over 40 years of experience to her pursuit of martial arts excellence. Following in the footsteps of her father Hanshi Bob Kranstz, who was inducted into the Milton Sports Hall

of Fame in 2018, Darlene has carved her own career path that has led her around the world as a high-performance athlete representing Milton.

Darlene's sporting resume is not only noteworthy, but also historic. She is a four-time world champion (1988, 1992, 1995 and 1996) and was a North American champion in 1989. Darlene became an inductee of the World Martial Arts Hall of Fame in 1992. In 1994, she was named Instructor of the Year by the Canadian Jiu-Jitsu Association, and a year later she was inducted into the Canadian Black Belt Hall of Fame. Finally, in 2000 she received a lifetime achievement award from the World Kobudo Federation.

After years of training and competition Darlene became head instructor and later owner of Milton Jiu-Jitsu, the same Milton dojo established by her father in 1974. She has inspired countless kids in Milton, encouraging respect and thoughtfulness in their daily lives. Her focus on the junior ranks and youth led the club's membership to swell to over 200 members.

Steve Condren | Horse Racing

If you can see it, you can be it. Those words hold true for Milton's Steve Condren.

Steve moved to town as a sixth-grader and it was a trip to the local Mohawk Racetrack that cemented his love for horse racing as a youngster.

Fast-forward through 30-plus years as one of the most respected and humble drivers in Canadian harness racing history, and it is easy to see why Steve is so beloved by Miltonians as a fixture of Mohawk Racetrack.

Steve led the Ontario Jockey Club as its top driver for numerous years in the 1980s, 90s and 2000s. He has won an incredible 6,859 races, guiding his winners to more than \$114-million. Perhaps his most memorable victory came in 1989 when he won the \$1-million North America Cup, the richest harness race on the continent.

In 1996, Steve captured the prestigious Breeders Crown on his home track in Campbellville. He followed that up in 1997 with the O'Brien Award as Canada's Driver of the Year. In 2011 he was inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

Travis Gerrits | Aerial Skiing

Born and raised in Milton, Travis Gerrits' sporting journey is one of incredible heights. From local gymnastics to the Olympics in Russia, Travis never forgot his roots.

Travis's fearless career began to gain momentum in the mid-2000s on the Nor-Am circuit after a series of podium finishes catapulted him into the World Cup. By 2011 his talent put Milton on the map, and Travis was Fédération Internationale de Ski Rookie of the Year.

His global career took flight during the spring

of 2013. Travis secured two World Cup second-place finishes and achieved an impressive World Championship silver in Norway. With his second-place result at Worlds, Travis qualified for the 2014 Winter Olympics, where he represented Canada with a 7th place finish.

Never one to wilt under the brightest lights, Travis took centre-stage at China's 90,000-seat national stadium, the Bird's Nest, in December 2013. Performing a perfect quadruple twisting, triple-flip on his final jump, Travis not only won gold, but he secured the circuit's prestigious yellow bib as World Cup leader.

Throughout his remarkable career Travis battled and overcame numerous injuries. In his post-career life, he is an outspoken Canadian mental health advocate.
