Jack Roberts | Baseball

Tack Roberts was born in the hamlet of Campbellville in 1934. After a notable juvenile-level career in his hometown, a newly formed Intermediate team, the Campbellville Merchants, was eager to bring the young pitcher into the fold when its players first stepped onto the field, under the direction of Len Andrews, in 1952.

Over the course of his stellar amateur career, the southpaw hurler would win 180 games for his "Village Nine" team, dropping only 46 decisions, recording a winning percentage of .796.

The Merchants' fans instantly took to their star, as his 1.89 earned run average propelled Campbellville to an unheard of 12 Ontario titles in 16 years. In a village of merely 300 residents at the time, it was not unusual for 1,400 or more fans to pack the Old Ball Park to see their ace terrorizing opponents' line-ups.

Nicknamed "Banana" for the way he intimidated batters with sidearm pitches that appeared to be headed straight for left-handed opponents, Jack's victories accounted for 43.5% of the team's 411 wins during a 16-year reign of domination, of which he pitched in 15 seasons.

The zenith of his powers came quite possibly in 1966, when at age 32 he pitched two back-to-back no-hitters in the Ontario Baseball Association's final series. Only a single error in each game prevented him a perfect 18 innings, as he did not walk a single batter in either match.

Jack passed away in 2022 at the age of 87, secure in the knowledge he held one of the greatest amateur pitching careers this province has ever seen.

Steve LeBlanc | Sports Writer

Steve LeBlanc diligently covered local sports for The Milton Canadian Champion for 25 years and was the longest serving sports reporter in the newspaper's 160-year history.

Acting as a trusted steward, Steve meticulously reported on everything from local minor championships, rising stars, and international professionals.

Through it all, Steve was the conduit through which Miltonians could not only follow their sons' and daughters' exploits at the rink, field or pitch, but

also find pride in those who had risen to the global or national sports scene and were representing Milton on the big stage.

Steve's consummate approach saw him ride shotgun on numerous road trips from Ontario Minor Hockey Association (OMHA) Junior A hockey to provincial high school championships, and more.

Another hallmark of Steve's coverage would be to relentlessly call down to the local rink staff late at night to find out if any word could be had on the outcome of this week's story of interest.

Though minor league local sports have always been Steve's bread and butter, the 2015 Pan-Am Games, with its Milton-based track cycling, are a highlight of his sports reporting career to be sure.

While it is difficult to quantify Steve's impact on the town's sporting history or landscape, unquestionably there is not a single inductee of the Milton Sports Hall of Fame that Steve has failed to profile.

In recognition of his dedication to his journalistic craft, Steve has repeatedly been granted industry awards, and in 2011-12 he received the OMHA Media Award.

Always striving to respectfully treat each new story with diligence and perspective, Steve has been the Town of Milton's author of record and its sporting history's caretaker. He has always "championed" Milton.







Glenn Turner | Baseball

o one in Milton has contributed to baseball as long and as fully as Glenn Turner. As a five-year-old, he first came to love the game and played minor ball from 1960-76, winning Ontario Baseball Association (OBA) titles twice.

He continued to find new ways to contribute when he took up umpiring for the rep minor league from 1974 to the early 1990's.

It was in his teens when Glenn got his first taste of coaching, first with house league and

then as an assistant for the local bantams. From there, he would go on to coach Milton's juvenile- and junior-level teams for 15 years, again winning two provincial championships.

In 1977, Glenn and some others formed the Milton senior team. He shone as their catcher and centre fielder, earning MVP honours in 1981. Glenn stepped up to become player-coach, before graduating to Red Sox general manager in 1987. Under his watch as GM, they won four OBA championships and have been finalists three times.

In all, he has been to 13 OBA finals as a player, coach or general manager.

Glenn took particular pride in the diamond maintenance at the then-new Brian Best Park in 1978, doing so for 33 years before serving as advisor to the Town on the creation of two new Community Park diamonds more recently.

In 2008, Glenn was Milton Chamber of Commerce Sportsman of the Year. To this day, he remains active as the Milton Red Sox's GM.







Keith Pearce | Football

Feith Pearce began working at Milton District High School (MDHS) in 1986, and he instantly recognized a void in not only his school's athletic offerings, but also within the Town of Milton.

Initially working alongside Keith Swarbrick and Doug Foley with the existing Junior squad, which was seeing success, Coach Pearce set to work at MDHS on building up Milton's first winning, organized Senior football program. His first steps were to reinstate the school's inactive senior team.

At the outset, Keith's goals were lofty considering that no other secondary school in Milton had a senior-level football program, and there were no minor football organizations either. Thus began a labour of love each season that saw Keith methodically start each year with sessions on how to put equipment on, the game's rules, positions, and other idiosyncrasies.

Over the next 30-plus years, Keith's grassroots efforts sprung to life, germinating an idea into a reality for hundreds of Milton youth who felt like they finally had a place where they could grow, flourish, and belong. That was in the "Blue and White" team colours.

"The Mustang Brotherhood," as it came to be known, won four Senior titles and was a finalist eight times under the leadership of Coach Pearce and his successful coaching staff over the years. The Mustang football factory churned out countless university football graduates – some of them All-Canadian All-Stars, a few of them Canadian Football League players. All of them thankful for Keith's guidance, direction, and mentorship.

Nancy McDonell-Lemaire | Figure Skating

ancy McDonell-Lemaire first began her skating journey in 1973 with the Milton Skating Club at the Brown Street Arena. She skated competitively up to the junior level before switching to coaching.

For over 30 years Nancy has guided figure skating's next generations as their coach and mentor, all the while taking Milton Skating Club from a very small operation to one of Skate Canada's largest and ever-prominent clubs.

Nancy's impact is limitless. From three-year-old

CanSkate newbies to Canadian Olympians, her passion for teaching is without bounds.

Time after time, Nancy's former pupils have gone on to become certified instructors themselves, returning to the same rinks of their youth to follow Nancy in her pursuit to pass along the skating skills necessary to conquer an axel or merely to glide unaided up the ice for the first time.

Nancy's dedication to her craft is evident in her lifelong commitment to stay behind that extra hour, to travel that extra mile to an event, and most importantly to provide that extra care and calm at overseas competitions.

Her accomplishments extend beyond the rink to the successful implementation of a high-performance sports program in Halton's elementary and secondary schools, affording elite skaters more opportunities to train while still receiving an education. It is a program that has been replicated by many other local high-performance athletes and organizations.

At the time of her induction, Nancy is Milton Skating Club's technical director, a national- and Olympic-level coach, and a positive role model to countless more. It is clear she has imparted a sense that representing Milton comes before oneself upon the skaters she has uplifted.
