





NEIL TEAGUE Softball



Born in Derrygonnelly, Northern Ireland, Neil Teague moved to Canada and first started his softball career in Omagh in 1975, as an eight-year-old, and after an esteemed 38-year career, he retired from competitive softball play in 2013.

As a hard-hitting righty, Neil worked his way through the local softball ranks and made the jump to provincial, national and international success. From 1994 to 2013, Neil enjoyed major successes, including five national titles, three provincial titles, two Ontario Amateur Softball Association elimination titles and went on to Canada's national men's softball team.

Always a leader on championship teams, Neil also played first base and went 4-for-4 in the title game of the SPN Men's "A" Ontario Championships in 2004, scoring all four times.

In 2012, Neil finally captured an elusive title, the prestigious Yvon 'Pif' Depatie International Invitational Championship, one of North America's largest softball tournaments. With his then-six-year-old son serving as bat boy, the team presented the trophy to Neil to keep, knowing how many years he had been chasing his dream.

Neil has also shown his commitment to the sport off the field by founding the Aidan Teague/Mac Kids Charity Softball Classic, netting over \$125,000 to support McMaster Children's Hospital in honour of the care given to Neil's family during the difficult birth of his son.

From 2007 to 2014, Neil also founded the Aidan Teague/Spring Training with the Pros events in North Carolina, Florida and Nevada. These events raised funds for McMaster Children's Hospital and local children in need.

Neil's impact extends well beyond Canada's borders. At Spring Training with the Pros in Florida in 2014, he inspired one young man with autism, then 18-year-old Taylor Duncan – through Neil's culture of acceptance, teamwork and inclusion – to found Alternative Baseball, a non-profit that brings baseball to teens and adults with autism and other special needs.

In 2017, Neil was inducted into the Ontario Softball Summit SPO Hall of Fame.

Currently, in addition to coaching teams in both Milton Girls Softball and Milton Minor Baseball, Neil is the founding partner and instructor at M3 Baseball Academy in Milton.



JIM RIDLEY Baseball



Jim Ridley is baseball. Canadian baseball. Milton baseball. Baseball. Period.

Jim dedicated the better part of his life to baseball. No matter its form. No matter its level. It permeated his life, through and through, from work to family to fun.

After two seasons as an outfielder with the Milwaukee Braves in 1964-65, Jim Ridley returned to Canada where he would have a significant impact on baseball for the next 40 years.

While continuing to play in the Intercounty Baseball League, where he was named league MVP in

1974, Jim launched his storied coaching and scouting career. He began as a part-time scout with the Detroit Tigers, before quickly joining the Toronto Blue Jays in 1976 to run the club's very first tryout camp in Utica, New York.

In his 26 years as a scout with the Blue Jays, Jim was the driving force behind the decisions to sign Canadians like Paul Spoljaric, Rob Butler and David Corrente. Jim also served as a coach with the Jays' affiliate team in Medicine Hat from 1978 to 1980.

As a highly respected coach at the local level, Jim also led the Canadian Junior National Team from 1983 to 1988 guiding them to two bronze medals at the World Junior Championships. He also coached the Canadian Olympic baseball team in 1988 and three years later he managed the Canadian squad at the Pan Am Games.

In 2002, Jim served as a scout with the Minnesota Twins and was later inducted posthumously into the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2014.

Amongst his greatest accomplishments was certainly his family, including his daughter and two sons. Both boys, Jeremy and Shayne, picked up his love of the game, playing for Ball State University. Jeremy was later drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays, with the Baltimore Orioles selecting Shayne.

A consummate educator, Jim's day job saw him as a teacher, until his retirement in 1995, which also afforded him the opportunity to coach both of his boys on the Milton District Mustangs baseball team.

Jim passed away in 2008 and each year the Canadian Baseball Network presents the Jim Ridley Award to the country's top scout in his memory.

WAYNE GUARD

LEON STICKLE Ice Hockey



Leon Stickle has spent his entire life in hockey, starting out as a young minor player, before his esteemed 27-year career as an NHI linesman.

But Leon's hockey exploits weren't the only ones to fill the local sports pages. Leon was an avid baseball player as well, suiting up for the Milton Intermediate Red Sox in the 1960's as a teenager. In the summer of 1964, Leon hit one triple to tie the game for the Sox, and then hit a second triple for the Milton Midgets to help win that game, just three days later.

In late 1966, Leon was also a local

snooker champion, receiving a large radio and an inscribed trophy for his efforts.

After starting with the Sarnia Junior "B" Legionnaires, Leon also excelled for several seasons with the O.H.A. Junior "C" Milton Merchants hockey team, where in 1965-66 he was among the team scoring leaders. He often teamed up with fellow linemate Craig Brush, who is the son of Milton Sports Hall of Fame inductee Dave Brush (2018).

In 1977, he admitted to the Milton Canadian Champion that during his time as a Merchants player, "I was a terrible referee-baiter. It's funny and it's been a great learning experience to be on the other side of the fence."

During his NHL career, Leon officiated six Stanley Cup finals, 2,069 regular season games, 206 playoff games, two Canada Cups, the 1979 Challenge Cup and Rendezvous '87.

He also officiated four NHL All-Star Games, including 1975 in Montreal, 1978 in Buffalo, NY, 1983 in Long Island, NY, and 1997 in San Jose, CA.

From 1994 until his retirement, he wore uniform number 33.

After retiring as an NHL linesman in 1998, Leon joined the Western Professional Hockey League, where he spent three seasons as supervisor of officials before being named director of officiating in 2000. He was then named NHL's supervisor of officials in 2003.

Leon continues to be involved in hockey today working with the Ontario Hockey League and Central Hockey League to develop younger officials starting out in their careers.

JANET CAMPBELL Gymnastics



The Halton Gymnastics Club was founded in 1973 and in 1975 saw a vacancy in the head coach position. After a lengthy and unsuccessful search, Janet Campbell "the light they had so wished for" arrived in 1977. Although she had no experience at running a club, and was fresh out of university, Janet was a previous gymnast and had a determination to succeed that made the rest history.

In 1978, due to a naming conflict with Halton Hills, the club pondered changing its name to the "Miltonettes", "Valdettes" or "Springers", before settling on the latter.

The club started with 12 competitive gymnasts and 30 recreational participants and the programs were held at E.C. Drury High School. With Janet's vision and strength, the club was molded into the present-day successful enterprise it is, with 55 competitive gymnasts and over 1,100 recreational participants.

In the early lean days of the club, Janet would sometimes hold back her paycheque just to keep the club afloat, setting up and taking down the equipment every night – a far cry from the expansive facility the club now enjoys at the Milton Sports Centre.

Janet spent 30 years as the head coach and chief administrator for the Milton Springers Gymnastic Club, only adding an office manager in 2003. Janet was a member of the Ontario Gymnastic Federation and was awarded an Honorary Life Membership upon her retirement. The Federation recognized the Milton Springers Gymnastics Club as the "Club of the Year" in 2006 out of 195 clubs in Ontario.

In June of 2007, Janet stepped down as head coach of the Springers. Two months prior, Celena Morgan secured Milton Springers' first-ever all-around provincial championship win.

Janet's impact on generations of Milton athletes cannot be overstated and has seen success in their post gymnastic careers, including Travis Gerrits (Canadian Olympic freestyle skier); Vicki Chliszczyk (head coach of Towson University Gymnastics in Maryland); Sydney Townsend (National junior team), to name a few.


Janet's career has been highlighted by numerous accomplishments including Provincial Coaching Chairperson; Ontario Representative to Gymnastics Canada; Ontario Gymnastics Federation Award Chairperson; Central Region Provincial Coach; Ontario Gymnastics Federation honours for years of service; ATHENA Award and Provincial Judge.

DARREN HAYDAR Ice Hockey



Overcoming challenges. Overcoming adversity. Themes that have come to define the life and career of Darren Haydar.

Sizable height and weight were once perceived as a tremendous advantage before the NHL's crackdown on obstruction. But at five-foot-nine, 170-pounds, Darren not only was ahead of his time, but he also carved out a career many could only hope for.

The Haydars first began filling the local sports pages in the mid-80s, with older brothers Jeff and Ryan leading the way.

Darren really began to turn heads in his third season with the Milton Merchants, setting league records with 71 goals and 140 points – a time when Hockey Night in Canada's

Ron MacLean, who refereed him, said Darren was just "unbelievable".

With back-to-back league titles and a Dudley Hewitt Cup in hand, Darren left Milton for the University of New Hampshire, where after just one season, the NHL's Nashville Predators selected him in the 1999 Entry Draft. Darren became a surefire star in New Hampshire – 76 points in 40 games in his final season and chants of "Hobey" serenading him, in reference to the NCAA award for hockey player of the year.

The crafty and cerebral winger would go on to lead both the Milwaukee Admirals and the Chicago Wolves to Calder Cup titles. Along the way, he featured in 23 NHL games for Nashville, Atlanta and Colorado.

In 2008 his future wife Sara was diagnosed with cancer, which she later beat, before Darren began to experience multiple sclerosis symptoms in 2012. But Darren continued to excel in Europe, before coming home and organizing an annual golf tournament for the MS Society. He continues to give back through his Milton hockey school.

To say that Darren is one of the greatest AHL players of all-time would be an understatement. Numerous AHL records and accolades are paired with his name – Rookie of the Year, All-Star, League Scoring Champion, League MVP, the stick and puck he used to break the longest AHL scoring streak of all-time is preserved in the Hockey Hall of Fame.

Challenges? Adversity? Now he's someone kids will look up to in the Milton Sports Hall of Fame.
