



Arguably the greatest sculptor of all time, Donatello (about 1386–1466) was at the vanguard of a revolution in sculptural practice in the early Renaissance. Combining ideas from classical and medieval art to create his own innovative style, he had an unparalleled ability to portray emotions in works intended to inspire spiritual devotion. Working in marble, bronze, wood, terracotta and stucco, Donatello contributed to major commissions of church and state; was an intimate of the Medici family sought after in other Italian cities. This book explores Donatello's extraordinary creativity within the vibrant artistic and cultural context of 15th-century Italy, surveying his early connection collaborative nature of his workshop and processes. It also reflects on Donatello's legacy, exploring how his sculpture inspired subsequent generations in the later Renaissance and beyond.





As one of the world's most recognised fashion brands, Chanel owes much to the templates first laid down by its founder – Gabrielle 'Coco' Chanel (1883–1971). Some of her most celebrated creations, such as the two-piece suit, the little black dress and the quilted handbag, remain in vogue to this day. Importantly Chanel designed first and foremost for herself: by creating clothes fit for an independent and active lifestyle, she anticipated the needs and wants of modern women.

This beautiful book presents a dazzling array of Chanel's most notable designs. Largely drawn from the collections of the Chanel Patrimoine in Paris and the V&A, and captured in stunning detail by renowned photographer Nicholas Alan Cope, this selection covers the breadth of the designer's 60 years at the forefront of fashion. The garments are brought to life by accompanying historic images, including fashion illustrations, archive photos, and shots of clients including Elizabeth Taylor and Lauren Bacall. The book examines the cut, construction, embellishment and provenance of each ensemble, as well as the themes and motifs Chanel returned to throughout her career, uniquely capturing the design evolution of this fashion icon.

For over a century, the name Chanel has been synonymous with feminine elegance, modernity and innovation in fashion. This lavishly illustrated book, newly expanded and updated, examines the creative output of Gabrielle 'Coco' Chanel (1883-1971) over the course of her long career and documents the creation and meteoric rise of the Chanel fashion empire and the products that bear its exclusive label – haute couture, ready-to-wear, accessories, jewellery and perfumes. A final chapter looks at the House after Chanel: the vision of creative director Karl Lagerfeld, who from 1983 until his death in 2019 ensured that the brand retained its position at the forefront of fashion's vanguard; and the reinterpreting of Chanel fashion signatures by his successor, Virginie Viard, today.

Published to accompany the LACMA exhibition Stone (20 August 2023 – 11 February 2024) This beautifully designed little book is the third in a series that captures highlights from the renowned Rosalinde and Arthur Gilbert Collection at the V&A. Focussing on 50 exquisite works it showcases the decorative art of creating small-scale carvings, snuffboxes, inlay pictorial illusions, and more, in cut-and-polished natural stones, often incorporating the widely known technique of pietre dure. Demonstrating remarkable skill and ingenuity, many of the works were commissioned by the powerful Medici family and royal families across Europe as symbols of their power and prestige. With detailed photography and extended captions the books explores the fascinating interplay of craftsmanship with the natural beauty of stones such as amethyst, lapis lazuli and jasper.


