Revolution & Counter-Revolution in Spain

An unaltered republication of Morrow's interpretation of the Spanish Civil War (despite the publisher's calling it a "second edition," the only new material is a 1½-page epilogue). It properly belongs in the realm of historiography, for Morrow interpreted the events in Spain to the American reading public according to a precise view. That view is Trotskyite "orthodox" Marxism. Originally published as *The Civil War in Spain* (1936) and *Revolution and counter-revolution in Spain* (1938), the two pieces reprinted here contain a massive indictment of Stalinism, which Morrow saw – in the guise of the Peoples' Front and the Socialist Party of Catalonia (PSUC) – as selling out the true revolutionaries. (Alan Guttman's *The wound in the heart*, 1962, sets Moscow's view in the wider spectrum of writers on the Civil War.) A glossary and index are included. Suitable for college libraries with Spanish Civil War collections.
