With this firsthand account of his involvement from the front lines of the Cuban Revolution, Zayas captures the heady days of late 1958early 1959 when Fidel Castro and Che Guevara "liberated" Fulgencio Batista's Cuba from a stranglehold of foreign interests and launched a new era for the people of that island. Zayas, a native of Puerto Padre, where the clandestine meetings of the 26 of July Movement began, offers us a step-by-step account of how a young son of sugar cane growers was swept away by Castro and Guevara's talk of a new world. In the autumn of 1958, Zayas joined the 140 men on horseback who made up the Column 8 that Guevara led from the Sierra Maestra to the Sierra Escambray and which greatly improved Castro's chances of bringing down Batista's regime. Zayas offers an insider's view of this movement and shows us his ascent through the new order that was established once the revolutionaries succeeded. Zayas went on to become a key player in Cuba's Angolan missions during the 1970s and 1980s and offers us his observations on how he viewed the Popular Liberation Movement of Angola among other reflections on the African scene. The book is generously illustrated and includes a glossary of individuals, organizations, and events.
