LAND OR DEATH: The Peasant

Currently being held without charges in Argentina, Peruvian peasant revolutionary leader Hugo Blanco wrote most of this book while prisoner on the noto-rious prison island, El Fronton, before he was released under a general amnesty in 1970. Blanco is acknowledged to be a foremost Latin American revolutionary, Trotskyist in his views, Guevarist in per-sonality and dynamics. His account of his work among Peruvian peasants, and of the peasants' plight, is most graphically effective in describing how, after the disastrous 1970 earthquake, Indian peas-ants died by the thousands while most aid went to the landed classes.
