GOT BAG's 2023 Collection Achievement:

972,111 lbs

In 2023, our collective efforts at our clean-up program have led to the collection and processing of 972,111 lbs of Ocean Impact Plastic. Our approach is comprehensive; we collect all types of plastic waste. This total figure includes the plastic that we have not only collected from various sources but also thermally and mechanically recycled.

It's important to note that this number does not account for additional plastic collected which is even more and currently in storage awaiting to be processed. These materials, still to be sorted and further processed, will soon join the ranks of our recycling efforts, contributing to our ongoing mission.



In 2023, GOT BAG Indonesia's collection initiative extended its reach to a total of 19 communities in three different regions, significantly enhancing our impact on reducing plastic pollution. A notable milestone was the inclusion of the third region Bantul in the South of

Java, adding a fresh dynamic to our efforts since January 2023. Our streamlined process of sorting and processing the collected materials is efficiently managed at the two GOT BAG Indonesia warehouses in Jepara and Bantul.

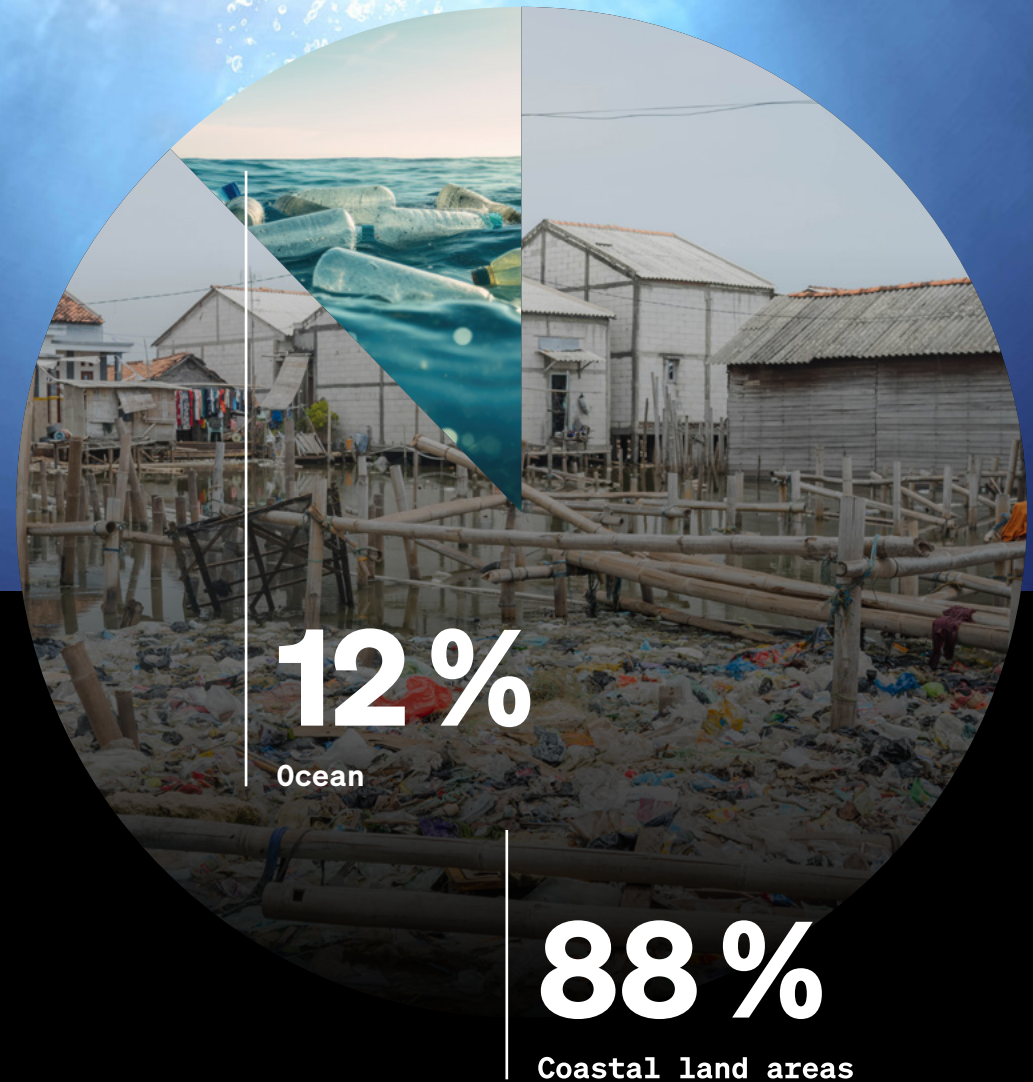

EXPANDING COLLECTION EFFORTS ACROSS COMMUNITIES

WHERE WE COLLECT

Our journey began as a “Fishing for Litter” project, where fishermen brought to shore the plastic they coincidentally caught in their nets alongside fish. However, we soon realized that to truly tackle the plastic pollution problem, we needed to address the problem at its root.

Most of the plastic waste in the sea originates from land sources and predominantly reaches the oceans through rivers, especially in areas lacking effective waste management systems. Therefore, collecting plastic waste in these coastal regions is particularly impactful. By intercepting it before it enters the sea, we significantly reduce the likelihood of its leakage into the ocean. We refer to this plastic as Ocean Impact Plastic, emphasizing its potential effect on marine environments if not collected.

Our Collection of Various Plastic Types and Recycling Methods

At GOT BAG, our collection efforts encompass a diverse range of plastic types, each contributing significantly to our goal of reducing plastic pollution in the ocean. We collect various forms of plastics, including PET bottles and hard plastics like shampoo bottles,

which are prevalent in everyday waste. Additionally, a substantial portion of our collection consists of low value materials, such as sachets and similar items that contain multi-layer materials.

When it comes to recycling these collected plastics, our approach is multifaceted:

1

Mechanical Recycling:

Local recycling partners mechanically process our collected plastic such as PET bottles. This recycled material is then utilized for the production of our own backpacks or sold to partners who make different products. This method ensures that the plastic can be integrated into new, functional products.

2

Thermal Recycling:

Unfortunately, not all plastic types can be recycled mechanically. Therefore we collaborate with the industry, which uses plastic waste as an alternative to coal for combustion. Incineration is far from being a good solution for plastic waste. We are constantly looking for better alternatives, however, it is currently the best option available. We do not dump any plastic waste on landfills – which are often not sufficiently managed and therefore leak waste and toxins into the environment.

EDUCATION & AWARENESS

2023 marked a significant step forward in our educational efforts with the introduction of clean-up events and the conduction of an environment camp for young people.

Clean-Up Events:

We successfully hosted 5 clean-up events throughout the year, engaging a total of 323 participants. These events were a new initiative, attracting volunteers from outside our regular collection communities to experience the collection of plastic waste at a dedicated beach for a few hours. The aim was to raise awareness about the scale of plastic pollution and the efforts required to remove it from the environment. By involving individuals beyond the program's usual collection communities, these clean-up activities provided volunteers a hands-on experience that highlighted the severity of the pollution and the importance of taking action.

Youth Enviro Camp:

Our first Environment Camp took place for two days, a weekend full of activities for 55 young individuals. The camp's objective was to sensitize the younger generation to plastic pollution and environmental conservation and offered different perspectives of how to get active in the fight against plastic pollution.

Activities included:

- Interactive lectures and discussions with environmental activists
- Hands-on experience in collecting plastic waste
- Pine tree planting to promote ecological restoration
- Painting and setting up signs at a public beach to spread awareness about littering



PLANTING MANGROVES AND PINE TREES

MANGROVES

Mangroves provide habitats for diverse marine life and prevent soil erosion. Their roots stabilize shorelines, offering natural protection against environmental impacts. Every year, the communities of our collection groups at the coastline in Demak face heavy floods because of soil erosion among others. Therefore, we continued to plant mangroves as in the year 2022.

PINE TREES

Along the coast, pine trees offer shade, making beaches more accessible for local recreation and enhancing the natural landscape for community enjoyment. We planted 100 pine trees at a beach in Bantul which will offer natural sources of shadow at the beach.

CORALS PLANTED

Since 2022, GOT BAG has proudly partnered with Coral Gardeners, an organization committed to the restoration and preservation of coral reefs. For every backpack sold featuring the Coral Gardeners' logo, we contribute to their remarkable efforts. Each purchase leads to the

planting of a coral, directly linking our customers to the tangible impact of reef restoration.

Coral Gardeners operate vital projects on Moorea and Fiji, where they cultivate coral gardens. These efforts are becoming increasingly important as

many coral reefs around the world are under threat, primarily due to climate change and rising sea temperatures. Coral reefs are essential for the health and balance of the oceans, serving as habitats for diverse marine life and helping maintain ecological equilibrium.

For every collaboration backpack with Sea Shepherd's logo sold, 10 % of the sales price goes to them. This initiative has enabled us, along with our GOT BAG community, to support Sea Shepherd's crucial work. Sea Shepherd is known for its active and direct approach to conserving marine wildlife and habitats. Our contribution helps

their efforts in combating illegal fishing, protecting endangered species, and preserving delicate marine ecosystems. Through this partnership, we not only provide financial support but also help raise awareness about the conditions our oceans are facing today.

Ric O'Barry's Dolphin Project plays a crucial role in the protection of dolphins across the globe. They are committed to ending the capture and exploitation

of dolphins, promoting their conservation, and ensuring their freedom and natural habitat.

With every GOT BAG product sold as part of this collaboration, 10 % of the proceeds support the Dolphin Project's mission. In 2023, the amount of

our donations was \$ 700. This initiative helps in providing much-needed resources for their conservation activities. More than just financial support, this partnership is about uniting our voices to raise awareness of the human-made challenges dolphins face, e.g. through our shared social media activities.
