


Little Fabric Shop Quilt

A Progressive Skill Quilt Log Cabin Blocks




Fabric Used: Assorted Cotton + Steel Basics









FINISHED BLOCK SIZE: H: 12" x W: 12"

DIFFICULTY: Beginner

SEAM ALLOWANCE: 1/4" throughout pattern

unless indicated.

DIMENSIONS: are written height x width

throughout instructions.

PRIOR TO SEWING: Read all of the directions

before beginning project.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:


The table below indicates the fabric requirements for the *ENTIRE* quilt. Additionally, it provides information on the color names and color letters. We recommend quilter's weight cotton for this project. We used Cotton + Steel Basics fabric.

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS:

Use the Block Layout Guide below along with the Cutting Chart to cut out all of the fabrics.

SUPPLIES:

Ruler, Scissors, Rotary Cutter, Mat, Pins, Iron, 1/4-Inch Presser Foot, Sewing Machine

FABRIC SIDES:

We will use the corresponding color to the block to indicate the Right Side of Fabric (RSF). White will indicate the Wrong Side of Fabric (WSF).




Right Side of Fabric: **RSF**

ASSEMBLE LOG CABIN BLOCKS:

Below is a guide demonstrating how all the log cabin blocks will be laid out.




CREATE LOG CABIN BLOCKS

You will create 4 individual Log Cabin Blocks in this section.

STEP 1: SEW BLOCKS 1 & 2

Place **BLOCK 2** on top of **BLOCK 1** with RSF facing each other.



Sew blocks together using a ¼-inch seam allowance.



Press seam towards Block 2. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.




STEP 2: SEW BLOCK 3 TO BLOCKS 1 & 2

Place **BLOCK 3** on top of sewn Blocks 1 & 2 with RSF each other.




Sew as diagramed below and press seam towards Block 3. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.




STEP 3: ATTACH BLOCK 4

Place **BLOCK 4** on top of sewn Blocks 1, 2, & 3 with RSF each other. Sew as diagramed below.




Press seam towards Block 4. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.




STEP 4: ATTACH BLOCK 5

Place **BLOCK 5** on top of sewn Blocks 1, 2, 3 & 4 with RSF each other. Sew as diagramed below.




Press seam towards Block 5. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.




STEP 5: ATTACH BLOCK 6

Place **BLOCK 6** on top of sewn Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 with RSF each other. Sew as diagramed below.




Press seam towards Block 6. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.




STEP 6: ATTACH BLOCK 7

Place **BLOCK 7** on top of sewn Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 with RSF each other. Sew as diagramed below.




Press seam towards Block 7. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.




STEP 7: ATTACH BLOCK 8

Place **BLOCK 8** on top of sewn Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 with RSF each other. Sew as diagramed below.




Press seam towards Block 8. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.



STEP 8: ATTACH BLOCK 9

Place **BLOCK 9** on top of sewn Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 with RSF each other. Sew as diagramed below. Press seam towards Block 9. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.




STEP 9: ATTACH BLOCK 10

Place **BLOCK 10** on top of sewn Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 with RSF each other. Sew as diagramed below. Press seam towards Block 10. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.

STEP 10: ATTACH BLOCK 11

Place **BLOCK 11** on top of sewn Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 with RSF each other. Sew as diagramed below. Press seam towards Block 11. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.




STEP 11: ATTACH BLOCK 12

Place **BLOCK 12** on top of sewn Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 with RSF each other. Sew as diagramed below. Press seam towards Block 12. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.


STEP 12: ATTACH BLOCK 13

Place **BLOCK 13** on top of sewn Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 & 12 with RSF each other. Sew as diagramed below. Press seam towards Block 13. Repeat for the remaining 3 blocks.



NEXT STEPS:

You should have a total of four Log Cabin Blocks. Set these four blocks aside for now. In the future, we will give you instructions on how to use these blocks to create the quilt top. Stay tuned!
