Clover Mini Quilt Pattern

Finished Size: H: 14" x W: 14"



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DIFFICULTY: Advanced Beginner

SEAM ALLOWANCE: 1/4" throughout pattern

DIMENSIONS: are written height x width throughout instructions.

MATERIALS:

This is a great pattern for fabric scraps!

One Fat Quarter Green Quilter's Weight Fabric - or - Assorted Quilter's Weight Green Fabric at least 1.5" x 1.5" in size.

One Fat Quarter Low Volume Quilter's Weight Fabric -or- Assorted Quilter's Weight Low Volume Fabric at least 1.5" x 1.5" in size.

1/2 yard coordinating Binding Fabric.

One 18" x 18" Quilting Batting

SUPPLIES:

Half Square Triangle (HST) Ruler, Straight Ruler, Scissors, Rotary Cutter, Straight Pins, Sewing Scissors, Binding Clips and Safety Pins.

Number of Blocks Chart:

Note: Half Square Triangle = HST

FABRIC COLOR	FABRIC SIZE	NUMBER
Green Squares	1.5" x 1.5"	69
Low Volume Squares	1.5" x 1.5"	102
Low Volume Rectangles	1.5" x 1"	10
Green for HST	3" x 3"	12
Low Volume for HST	3" x 3"	8

CUTTING:

Green Squares:

Cut out a total of 69 - H: 1.5" x W: 1.5" assorted green fabrics.

Low Volume Squares:

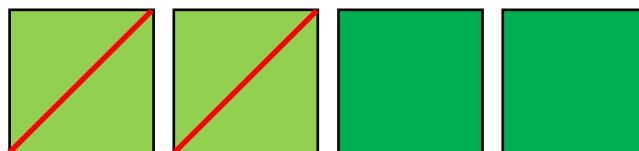
Cut out a total of 102 - H: 1.5" x W: 1.5" assorted low-volume fabrics.

Love Volume Rectangles:

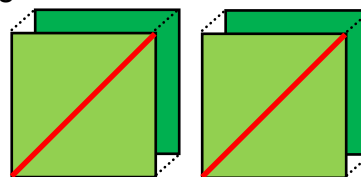
Cut out a total of 10 - H: 1.5" x W: 1.0" assorted low-volume fabrics.

Green & Green Half Square Triangles:

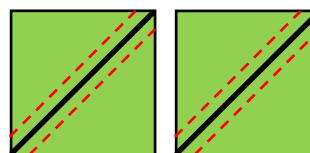
Cut out 4 - H: 3.0" x W: 3.0" green squares. Draw a diagonal line across two of the green squares on the WRONG side of the fabric.



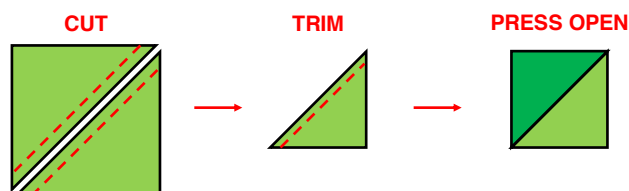
Place each diagonal marked green square on top of the unmarked green square - WRONG sides facing out and RIGHT sides facing each other.



Using the marked diagonal line as a guide, sew a 1/4" seam allowance to sewing along both sides of center marked line.

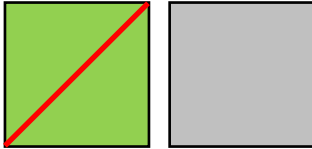


Cut sewn square along marked diagonal line. Then trim down each of the four triangles down to 1.5" x 1.5" square using a HST Ruler. Press open seam.

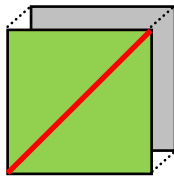


Green & Low Volume Half Square Triangles:

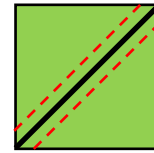
1. Cut out 8 - H: 3.0" x W: 3.0" green squares and 8 - H: 3.0" x W: 3.0" low volume squares. Draw a diagonal line across the 8 of the green squares on the WRONG side of the fabric.



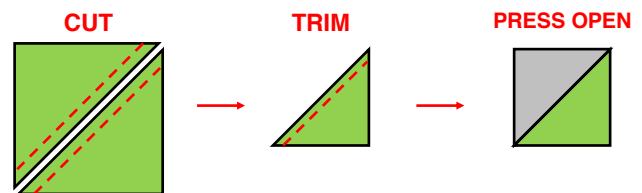
2. Place each diagonal marked green square on top of the unmarked low volume square - WRONG sides facing out and RIGHT sides facing each other.








3. Using the marked diagonal line as a guide, sew a 1/4" seam allowance to sewing along both sides of center marked line.

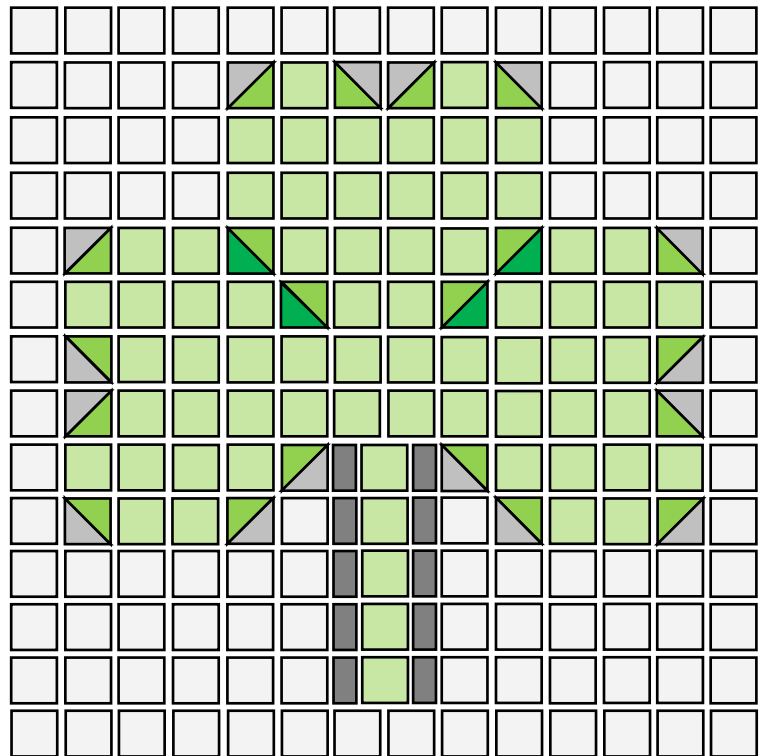


4. Cut sewn square along marked diagonal line. Then trim down each of the four triangles down to 1.5" x 1.5" square using a HST Ruler. Press open seam.



BLOCK LAYOUT GUIDE:

BLOCK	SHAPE	NUMBER
Green Squares		69
Low Volume Squares		102
Low Volume Rectangles		10
Green & Green HST		4
Low Volume & Green HST		16



STEP 1:

Cut & Prepare all of the blocks according to cutting and HST cutting & sewing instructions.

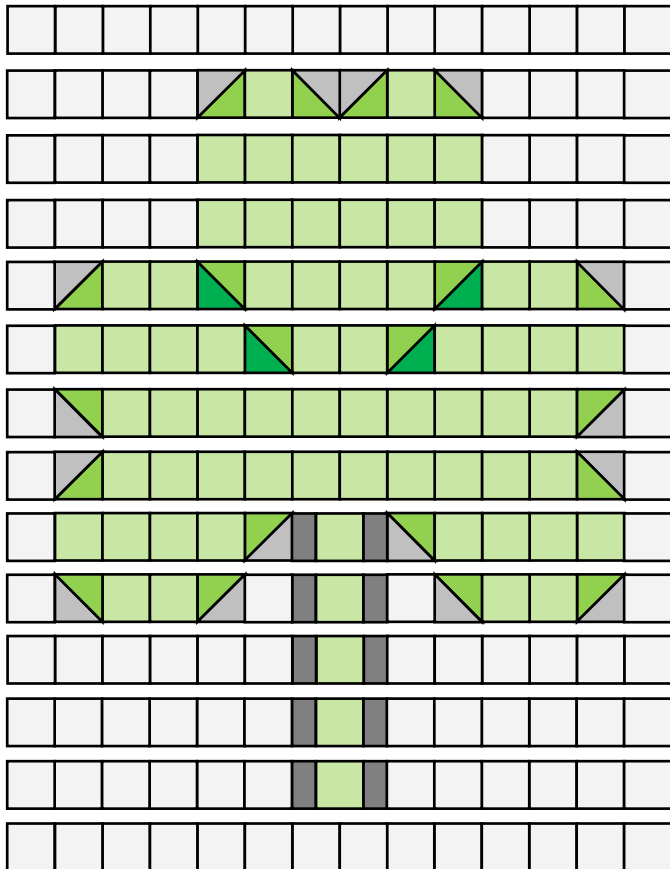
STEP 2:

Layout all the blocks utilizing the **Block Layout Guide** on page 3.

STEP 3:

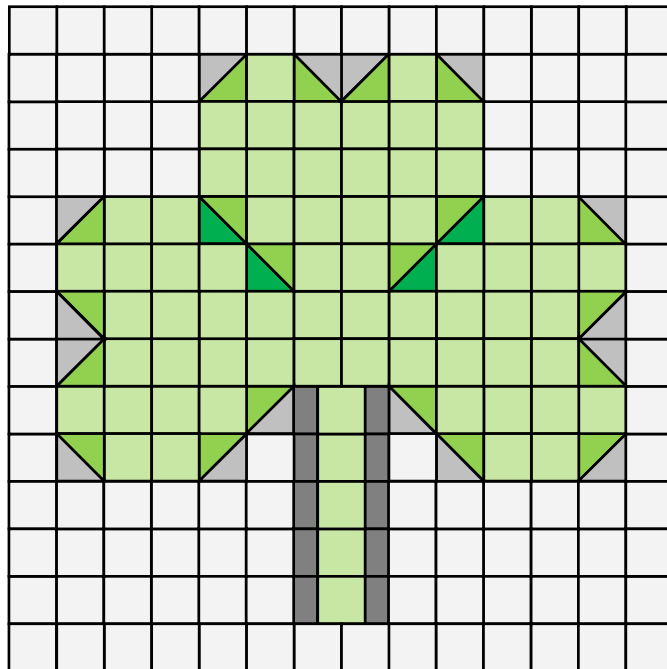
Begin sewing the top row of 14 blocks together using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams to the right. Sew the 2nd row of 14 blocks. Press seams to the left. Continue sewing remaining 12 rows. Alternate pressing right and left for each row.

The extra step of changing the direction of seam pressing between rows will allow you to nest the seams together in the next step to create more accurate corner joining.



STEP 4:

Sew all 14 rows together. Press open seams along each row.



STEP 5:

Finish this mini quilt any way you would like. I have included in this pattern, the materials needed to create a mini quilt, but this cute patchwork clover would make an adorable pillow or even a large fabric trivet by using insulation fleece such as Pellon 975 Insul Fleece.
