

Harvesting Hunted Animals for Petfood Examination

Everyone intending to supply hunted animals for petfood must understand the key requirements for harvesting and supplying poison-free hunted animals.

Intending suppliers are required to demonstrate knowledge of the “Operational Code: Petfood Processing” and the training booklet “Harvesting Hunted Animals for Petfood”.

Instructions:

1. Study the “Operational Code: Petfood Processing: Chapter 4 Harvesting and Processing of Hunted Animals” and the training booklet “Harvesting Hunted Animals for Petfood”.
2. Fill in this examination form and return to the petfood processor along with the form “*Application to become a Processor-Approved Hunter - Petfood*”.
3. Be clear about your answers and mark the form clearly.
4. There is no time limit.
5. This is an “open-book” exam. You may refer to either publication while you are filling out the exam.
6. The petfood processor will mark the exam and may ask further questions to ensure you understand the key requirements for harvesting poison-free hunted animals for petfood.
7. If satisfied that you understand these requirements, the processor will enter your name onto their list of approved hunters.
