



Routine Inspection & Maintenance

- Always check the RTT mounting hardware to make sure everything is tight, and nothing is missing. This includes your roof rack as well.
- It is recommended that you open your tent regularly to air them out between extended periods of time when not in use. A nice sunny day, heated garage and or use of a fan inside to help circulate the air
- Exterior body, seals, hinges, struts and hardware need be inspected and cleaned/washed on a regular basis
- Regular maintenance on moving parts with lubrication is recommended in both dry and wet weather regions.

Storage

- When storing your RTT off your vehicle when camping season is finished, do your best to protect your tent from any damage. The use of shipping blankets is an excellent way to prevent any run-ins or damage.
- Do not lay your tent flat on the ground, rodents do like to find nice warm places during the wintertime. The use of sawhorses or a table to prop the tent off the ground is best. If you have the ceiling height, hanging your tent with a lifting system is the ultimate way and helps clears up floor space.
- Yes, roof top tents can be left on your vehicle all year around. Routine inspection is recommended to check for tightness of mounting hardware, any rips or holes in the transits covers or hard-shell surface.

Wet Weather and Condensation

Take the following precautionary tips to provide years of enjoyment with your Roof Top Tent and to prevent any damage.

- A rule of thumb, it's always a good idea to open up and air out your RTT after every camp trip. This will help
 remove the smell of any campfire smoke, dry out any moisture and gives you a chance to clean out the inside for
 your next adventure.
- Very important not to not pack away a wet RTT for any length of time. This includes cloudy days, seaside and misty
 morning packs ups. Moisture cannot escape when packed up which can lead to fabric damage and possible mold
 development. No different than wet/damp clothing left unattended.
- Portable moisture absorbent packs are a great way to help reduce moisture build up when the tent is closed.

Cleaning

If your tent fabric encounters dirt, you can clean it with mild soap and a soft brush to gently wash it away. Never use a pressure washer and or a direct hose spray on your tent. A light misting spray is all that's needed to rinse it off. Once again, let your tent dry out completely before packing up.
