



Since the majority of Bear Bow owners are those who demand the best, Bear Bows are engineered to the highest standards of the most experienced archer or bowhunter. These requirements include a good bow that's fast and smooth, with even build-up all the way back to full draw and with velvet-like recoil. Consistent accuracy, too, is a requisite, as is sustained power or weight regardless of hot or cold temperatures in wet or dry weather. Another desirable quality is a bow that's featherlight-in-hand, for fast handling. And finally, the veteran bowman wants a bow of unusual beauty, grace of line and detailed craftsmanship, one that will be admired by his companions and be a source of pleasure for many years to come.

Bear meets all these requirements in every bow because the built-in superiority of each Bear glass-powered Bow is the result of years of bowmaking experience and of countless hours of range and field testing. And in this dedication to achieve perfection, hand craftsmanship has been combined with modern science. The results are bow masterpieces built up to exacting standards... never down to a price.

Technology produces magnum load velocity

Fiberglas does for Bear Bows what alloys do for steel—adds durability and longer life.

The hard maple core of the bow, functionally a neutral area, gives the bow its light weight and resiliency. The Fiberglas face-and-back elements add the all-important "backbone".


In the intricate process of making these Fiberglas strips lies the secret of Bear magnum load power, smoothness and uniform performance.

Glass facing and backing for all Bear Bows are produced in the Bear factory. From multiple spools of Fiberglas yarn, the taut fibers are combined with plastic resins. Under equal tension and lying perfectly parallel to each other, thousands upon thousands of closely packed continuous strands are bonded into a finished glass strip.

The glass strip is then laminated to the tapered hard maple core. In combination, these two elements provide the bow with magnum load hitting power and featherlight handling qualities. When the bow nears full draw each of the countless Fiberglas strands in facing and backing is under equal stress. All fibers "share the load", thereby eliminating undesirable surface stresses that occur when these elements are fabricated by any other method. The tremendous strength of these bonded fibers and their equal stress distribution give longer bow life.

This exclusive construction, fully protected by Bear patents nos. 2,613,660 and 2,665,678, insures a "glass-power" element which makes Bear Bows favorites of expert archers and bowhunters everywhere.

The result of Bear modern technology is the fastest, smoothest and lightest bow possible . . . a bow of enduring beauty and unequalled performance . . . a bow that's a thrill to shoot and a joy to own. It is Bear's answer for the discriminating bowman who wants the finest.



Inside story of the built-in "magnum load"

Bear-made Fiberglas face and back strips, with tapered plies of hard maple electronically bonded between, comprise the unique "sandwich" construction of all Bear Bows. This makes possible the weight-saving feature that makes a Bear glass-powered Bow so pleasingly featherlight in the hand. Because of the tremendous strength of the uniformly-stressed Fiberglas, the arrow is released with magnum load velocity . . . yet with unequalled smoothness.

For durability, lightness and hard-hitting effectiveness, this bow is an outstanding value. Since the GRIZZLY first appeared, it has taken more game than any other bow made. As proof of its reliability, this veteran bow has long been a favorite of thousands who enjoy target, field, roving or hunting.

GRIZZLY is the forerunner of modern high-performance bow design. Although the current trend is toward the Bear working recurve, GRIZZLY remains in great demand among those who prefer the conventional recurve and graceful symmetry of this famous bow.

Length, 62". Draw limit, 28". Weights, 30 to 75 lbs. Not available in other lengths or in heavier weights.

When ordering any Bear Bow

Specify bow length, draw weight and draw length. To expedite delivery, orders may be filled in weights within two lbs. plus or minus, unless otherwise requested. All bows (except the 56" KODIAK) are weighed at 28" draw and are so marked. When ordering Bear KODIAK SPECIAL, KODIAK and POLAR Bows, specify right hand or left hand models. Both GRIZZLY and CUB have dual arrow rests for right or left hand bowmen.

Bear Bow construction is endurance-tested on a mechanical shooting machine. It operates at the rate of 1,000 shots an hour, shooting a steel slug approximately the weight of an arrow. Constant checking with this equipment is your assurance that bows bearing the name of BEAR will send your arrows with magnum load velocity, give long life and will provide the utmost in shooting enjoyment for you.







IMPORTANT

To find the right arrow length for your arm span, place the nock end of an arrow against the center of your chest and reach out on it with your arms extended straight in front of you. If the arrow is the correct length for you, it will extend to the end of the fingertips. Lacking an arrow, a yardstick can be used for this measurement.

when ordering arrows, specify the bow weight: 40 to 45 lbs., 45 to 50 lbs., etc., and the arrow or draw length.

Also when ordering, be sure to use code letters shown on chart above to indicate type of point desired.


Shorter, lower feathers will be used on all arrows for bows under 45 lbs.



Permanent finish is chemically correct to take fletching cement. Its extra stability makes it extremely accurate for tournament and field—and the finest hunting arrow made. Diameter and spine to match your bow weight and draw length. Note: Finished weight of Bearglas B-100 Arrows with hunting or field points will weigh in grains approximately 9 times the bow weight.




Thousands of bowhunters have found the Bear Bow Quiver to be the best means of carrying hunting arrows while in the field. With the introduction of the Fred Bear Razorheads, this bow quiver has been redesigned especially to protect the extremely sharp edges of the broadheads and to guard against accidental injury. The new quiver will accommodate four arrows instead of three as before.

Broadheads or RAZORHEADS, which fit into a soft sponge rubber block, are completely shielded by a protective cowl. The open metal frame rods are sound-proofed with a resilient vinyl coating. Arrow shafts clip into a molded rubber holder which keeps the shafts and fletching apart. Quiet, light and convenient, the Bear Bow Quiver is first choice among bowhunters.



The Tape-On Model with its rigid, two point mounting, can be attached to the handle with ordinary household, adhesive or electrician's tape. Be sure to wax this section of your bow before taping.


