## Cutting

## WOF = Width of Fabric LOF = Length of Fabric

Note: Cut in the order given for best use of fabric. Handle on-point squares and cut triangles carefully, as bias edges will be stretchy.

## Fabric A, fussy cut:

(1) 11 " on-point square, centered on a motif of your choice

Fabric B, cut:
(2) $2 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(2) $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 14 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
(2) $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
(7) $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding

Fabric C, cut:
(1) $77 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $77 / 8^{"}$ squares, then cut each square once diagonally, from corner to corner, to make (8) triangles.

Fabric D, cut:
(1) $63 / 8$ " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(2) $63 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares
(2) $57 / 8^{" ~ s q u a r e s ~}$

Cut each $63 / 8$ " square twice diagonally to make (8) small triangles.
Cut each $57 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square once diagonally to make (4) large triangles.
(4) $2 \frac{1}{4} 4^{"} \times$ WOF; subcut
(20) $2 \frac{1}{4}$ " $\times 4$ " rectangles
(32) $2 \frac{1}{4} /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## Fabric E, fussy cut:

(2) $71 / 2$ " $\times$ LOF, centering on dinosaur motifs; subcut
(4) $7 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 28 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ outer borders

## Fabric F, cut:

(4) $7 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares (if desired, fussy cut on-point centered on a motif of your choice)
(4) 4 " squares
(4) $2 \frac{114 " ~}{} \times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 7 \frac{1}{2} 2^{1}$ rectangles
(40) $21 / 4$ " squares

## Fabric G, cut:

(4) $51 / 21 \times$ WOF; subcut
(24) $51 / 2$ " squares
(2) $61 / 4 " \times$ WOF; subcut
(6) $61 / 4 "$ squares. Cut each square twice diagonally, to make (24) triangles.

## Fabric H, cut:

(6) $51 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF; subcut (36) $51 / 2$ " squares

## Instructions

Note: All seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted. Sew pieces right sides together. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.

## Make the Center Block

1. Sew $2^{11 / 4} \times 11$ " Fabric B rectangles to opposite sides of the Fabric A square (Fig. 1). Press. Sew $2 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 14 \frac{1}{2} /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangles to the two remaining sides of the square. Press.

## Make the Star Blocks

2. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each 21/4" Fabric F square. Noting the orientation of the drawn line, place one square right sides together on one end of a $2 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4$ " Fabric $D$ rectangle (Fig. 2). Sew along the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a $1 / 4^{4}$ seam allowance. Press the triangle open. Repeat to add a second triangle to the opposite end of the rectangle as shown. Make a total of (20) Flying Geese units.

3. Arrange (4) $2 \underline{1} / 4$ " Fabric D squares, (4) Flying Geese units, and (1) 4" Fabric $\mathbf{F}$ square in three rows of three elements each, as shown (Fig. 3). Sew the elements in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances toward the squares. Sew the rows together along adjacent edges. Press. Make a total of (4) Star Blocks (7" $\times 7$ " finished).

## Make the Half-Star Blocks

4. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of (8) $2^{11 / 4 "}$ Fabric D squares. Noting the orientation of the drawn line, place one marked square right sides together on one end of a $21 / 4$ " $\times 7 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric $F$ rectangle (Fig. 4). Sew along the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press the triangle open. Repeat to add a second triangle to the opposite end of the rectangle as shown. Make a total of (4) units.

5. Sew a $2 \frac{114}{4}$ " Fabric $\mathbf{D}$ square to each short end of the remaining (4) Flying Geese units (Fig. 5). Press.

6. Noting orientations, sew one step 4 and one step 5 unit together along one long edge (Fig. 6). Press. Sew the short side of a Fabric D small triangle to each short end of the joined units. Press. Center and sew the long edge of a Fabric D large triangle to the upper edge of the unit. Press. Sew the long edge of two Fabric C triangles to the short sides of the unit. Press. Make a total of (4) Half-Star blocks ( $14^{\prime \prime} \times 7^{\prime \prime}$ finished).

## Quilt Top Assembly

7. Referring to the Quilt Layout diagram (page 6) for block orientation, sew a Half-Star Block to two opposite sides of the Center Block. Press. Sew a Star Block to each end of the two remaining Half-Star Blocks. Press. Sew one joined unit to the upper edge, and the other to the lower edge of the quilt center. Press.
8. Noting the fabric print direction of the $71 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 281 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E borders, sew two borders to opposite sides of the quilt center. Press the seam allowances toward the borders. Sew a $71 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $F$ square to each end of the two remaining Fabric $\mathbf{E}$ borders, noting the orientation of the squares if you chose to fussy cut them. Press the seam allowances toward the Fabric E borders. Sew one F/E border to the upper edge, and the other to the lower edge to complete the quilt center. Press.
9. Arrange (9) Fabric $\mathbf{H}$ squares, (6) Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ squares, and (6) Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ triangles in (6) rows, as shown (Fig. 7). Sew the squares in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances in opposite directions from row to row. Sew the rows together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances in one direction. Make a total of (4) triangular corner units.

10. Center and sew the long edges of two triangular corner units to opposite sides of the quilt center. Press. Center and sew the two remaining corner units to the remaining sides of the quilt center to complete the quilt top. Press.

## Finishing

11. Sew together the (7) $2^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
12. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the quilt top after quilting is completed.
13. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
14. Turn the binding to the back of the quilt and hand stitch in place.

(1) $77 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $77 / 8^{"}$ squares, then cut each square once diagonally, from corner to corner, to make (8) triangles.

## Fabric D, cut:

(1) $63 / 8 " \times$ WOF; subcut
(2) $63 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares
(2) $5 \% 8^{"}$ squares

Cut each $63 / 8$ " square twice diagonally to make (8) small triangles.
Cut each $57 / 8$ " square once diagonally to make (4) large triangles.
(4) $21 / 4 " \times$ WOF; subcut
(20) $2 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
(32) $2 \frac{1}{4} / 4$ squares

## Fabric F, cut:

(1) $71 / 21 \times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $7 \frac{1}{2} 2^{"}$ squares
(7) $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding

Fabric G, cut:
(4) $51 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(24) $51 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ squares
(2) $81 / 4$ " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(6) $8 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Cut each square twice diagonally, to make (24) triangles.

## Fabric H, cut:

(6) $51 / 21 \times$ WOF; subcut
(36) $5 \frac{1}{2} /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## Fabric I, cut:

(1) 4 " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $4^{\prime \prime}$ squares
(4) $2 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $2 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 7 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
(40) $21 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## Fabric E , fussy cut:

(2) $7 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ LOF, centering on dinosaur motifs; subcut
(4) $7 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 28 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ outer borders

## Make the Center Block

1. Sew $2^{11 / 4 " ~} \times 11$ " Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ rectangles to opposite sides of the Fabric A square (Fig. 1). Press. Sew $2 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 14 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangles to the two remaining sides of the square. Press.

## Make the Star Blocks

2. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each 21/4" Fabric I square. Noting the orientation of the drawn line, place one square right sides together on one end of a $2 \frac{1}{4}$ " $\times 4$ " Fabric $D$ rectangle (Fig. 2). Sew along the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a $1 / 4$ seam allowance. Press the triangle open. Repeat to add a second triangle to the opposite end of the rectangle as shown. Make a total of (20) Flying Geese units.

3. Arrange (4) $2 \frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric $\mathbf{D}$ squares, (4) Flying Geese units, and (1) 4" Fabric I square in three rows of three elements each, as shown (Fig. 3). Sew the elements in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances toward the squares. Sew the rows together along adjacent edges. Press. Make a total of (4) Star Blocks (7" x 7 " finished).

## Make the Half-Star Blocks

4. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of (8) $2^{1 / 4 "} 4^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D squares. Noting the orientation of the drawn line, place one marked square right sides together on one end of a $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 7 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I rectangle (Fig. 4). Sew along the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press the triangle open. Repeat to add a second triangle to the opposite end of the rectangle as shown. Make a total of (4) units.

5. Sew a $21 / 4$ " Fabric $D$ square to each short end of the remaining (4) Flying Geese units (Fig. 5). Press.

6. Noting orientations, sew one step 4 and one step 5 unit together along one long edge (Fig. 6). Press. Sew the short side of a Fabric D small triangle to each short end of the joined units. Press. Center and sew the long edge of a Fabric $\mathbf{D}$ large triangle to the upper edge of the unit. Press. Sew the long edge of two Fabric C triangles to the short sides of the unit. Press. Make a total of (4) Half-Star blocks (14" x $7^{\prime \prime}$ finished).

## Quilt Top Assembly

7. Referring to the Quilt Layout diagram (page 6) for block orientation, sew a Half-Star Block to two opposite sides of the Center Block. Press. Sew a Star Block to each end of the two remaining Half-Star Blocks. Press. Sew one joined unit to the upper edge, and the other to the lower edge of the quilt center. Press.
8. Noting the fabric print direction of the $71 / 2$ " $\times 28 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E borders, sew two borders to opposite sides of the quilt center. Press the seam allowances toward the borders. Sew a $71 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $F$ square to each end of the two remaining Fabric E borders, keeping the rainbow star stripes oriented the same for all 4 squares. Press the seam allowances toward the Fabric E borders. Sew one F/E border to the upper edge, and the other to the lower edge to complete the quilt center. Press.
9. Arrange (9) Fabric $\mathbf{H}$ squares, (6) Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ squares, and (6) Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ triangles in (6) rows, as shown (Fig. 7). Sew the squares in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances in opposite directions from row to row. Sew the rows together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances in one direction. Make a total of (4) triangular corner units.

## Aster-Persimmon Quilt

10. Center and sew the long edges of two triangular corner units to opposite sides of the quilt center. Press. Center and sew the two remaining corner units to the remaining sides of the quilt center to complete the quilt top. Press.

## Finishing

11. Sew together the (7) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
12. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the quilt top after quilting is completed.
13. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
14. Turn the binding to the back of the quilt and hand stitch in place.

Cut each $63 / 8$ " square twice diagonally to make (8) small triangles.
Cut each $57 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square once diagonally to make (4) large triangles.
(4) $2 \frac{114 " " \times \text { WOF; subcut }}{}$
(20) $21 / 4$ " $\times 4^{"}$ rectangles
(32) $21 / 4 "$ squares

## Fabric E, cut:

(2) $71 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ LOF, fussy cut centered on border prints on either side of yardage; subcut
(4) $71 / 2$ " $\times 28 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ outer borders

From the remaining interior print, cut:
(4) 4 " squares
(4) $2 \frac{1}{4}$ " $\times 7 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
(40) $21 / 4$ " squares

## Fabric F , cut:

(1) $71 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $71 / 2$ " squares

## Fabric G, cut:

(4) $51 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(24) $5^{1 / 2}{ }^{2}$ squares
(2) $8 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(6) $81 / 4 "$ squares. Cut each square twice diagonally, to make
(24) triangles.

Fabric H , cut:
(6) $51 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(36) $5 \frac{1}{2} /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## Aster-Seabreeze Quilt

## Instructions

Note: All seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted. Sew pieces right sides together. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.

## Make the Center Block

1. Sew $2 \frac{1}{4} / 4 \times 11$ " Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ rectangles to opposite sides of the Fabric A square (Fig. 1). Press. Sew $2 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 14 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangles to the two remaining sides of the square. Press.

## Make the Star Blocks

2. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each $21 / 4$ " Fabric E square. Noting the orientation of the drawn line, place one square right sides together on one end of a $2 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $D$ rectangle (Fig. 2). Sew along the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a $1 / 4 / 4$ seam allowance. Press the triangle open. Repeat to add a second triangle to the opposite end of the rectangle as shown. Make a total of (20) Flying Geese units.
3. Arrange (4) $2 \frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric $D$ squares, (4) Flying Geese units, and (1) 4" Fabric E square in three rows of three elements each, as shown (Fig. 3). Sew the elements in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances toward the squares. Sew the rows together along adjacent edges. Press. Make a total of (4) Star Blocks (7" x 7 " finished).

## Make the Half-Star Blocks

4. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of (8) $21 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D squares. Noting the orientation of the drawn line, place one marked square right sides together on one end of a $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 7 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E rectangle (Fig. 4). Sew along the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a $1 / 4 / 4$ seam allowance. Press the triangle open. Repeat to add a second triangle to the opposite end of the rectangle as shown. Make a total of (4) units.

5. Sew a $21 / 4$ " Fabric $D$ square to each short end of the remaining (4) Flying Geese units (Fig. 5). Press.

6. Noting orientations, sew one step 4 and one step 5 unit together along one long edge (Fig. 6). Press. Sew the short side of a Fabric D small triangle to each short end of the joined units. Press. Center and sew the long edge of a Fabric $\mathbf{D}$ large triangle to the upper edge of the unit. Press. Sew the long edge of two Fabric $\mathbf{C}$ triangles to the short sides of the unit. Press. Make a total of (4) Half-Star blocks (14" x $7^{\prime \prime}$ finished).

## Quilt Top Assembly

7. Referring to the Quilt Layout diagram (page 6) for block orientation, sew a Half-Star Block to two opposite sides of the Center Block. Press. Sew a Star Block to each end of the two remaining Half-Star Blocks. Press. Sew one joined unit to the upper edge, and the other to the lower edge of the quilt center. Press.
8. Noting the fabric print direction of the $71 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 28^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric $\mathbf{E}$ borders, sew two borders to opposite sides of the quilt center. Press the seam allowances toward the borders. Sew a $7 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric $\mathbf{F}$ square to each end of the two remaining Fabric E borders, noting the orientation of the squares if you chose to fussy cut them. Press the seam allowances toward the Fabric E borders. Sew one F/E border to the upper edge, and the other to the lower edge to complete the quilt center. Press.
9. Arrange (9) Fabric $\mathbf{H}$ squares, (6) Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ squares, and (6) Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ triangles in (6) rows, as shown (Fig. 7). Sew the squares in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances in opposite directions from row to row. Sew the rows together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances in one direction. Make a total of (4) triangular corner units.

10. Center and sew the long edges of two triangular corner units to opposite sides of the quilt center. Press. Center and sew the two remaining corner units to the remaining sides of the quilt center to complete the quilt top. Press.

## Finishing

11. Sew together the (7) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
12. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the quilt top after quilting is completed.
13. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4$ " and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
14. Turn the binding to the back of the quilt and hand stitch in place.
