The Habi-Sabi Little Bird Box has a standard design offering a choice of three different face pieces with varying entrance holes sized for different species to attract an array of birds, including Tit, Redstart, Nuthatch, Flycatcher, Wryneck, Sparrow and Wren. Although the size and shape of the entrance hole encourages specific species, many others factors are involved especially what food is locally available

Location: Each variety of bird will have a different preference but there are some basic rules to follow: boxes should be hung between 2 and 4m facing between north or east to avoid strong sunlight and wet winds. There must be a clear flight path to its entrance. For more info see www.rspb.org.uk



This up-cycled material may have slight imperfections, chips and surface variation, which we welcome as part of the Wabi-Sabi approach to recognising beauty in irregularity

Individual pieces are fragile - don't force together

If something doesn't fit, sand the joint with fine sandpaper until it does. Don't go overboard because the strength of the box lies in the tightness of the joints.

During the machining process dust is produced, some of which may still be present on your little bird box so please wash or wipe down the pieces before assembly

Available with 26mm, 32mm or 29 x 55mm entry hole
