4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing.

Closed containers may rupture violently if heated. Some curing agents when mixed with epoxy resins in large masses can produce vigorous exothermic reactions with considerable heat which may char the reactants, and released fumes and vapors from the thermal decomposition. During fire, hazardous combustion products are released that may include: Carbon oxides (COx, Aldehydes. Nitrogen Oxides, Ammonia.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Large Spills: Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Cover with plastic sheet to prevent spreading. Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Following product recovery, flush area with water.

Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination.
