Texture

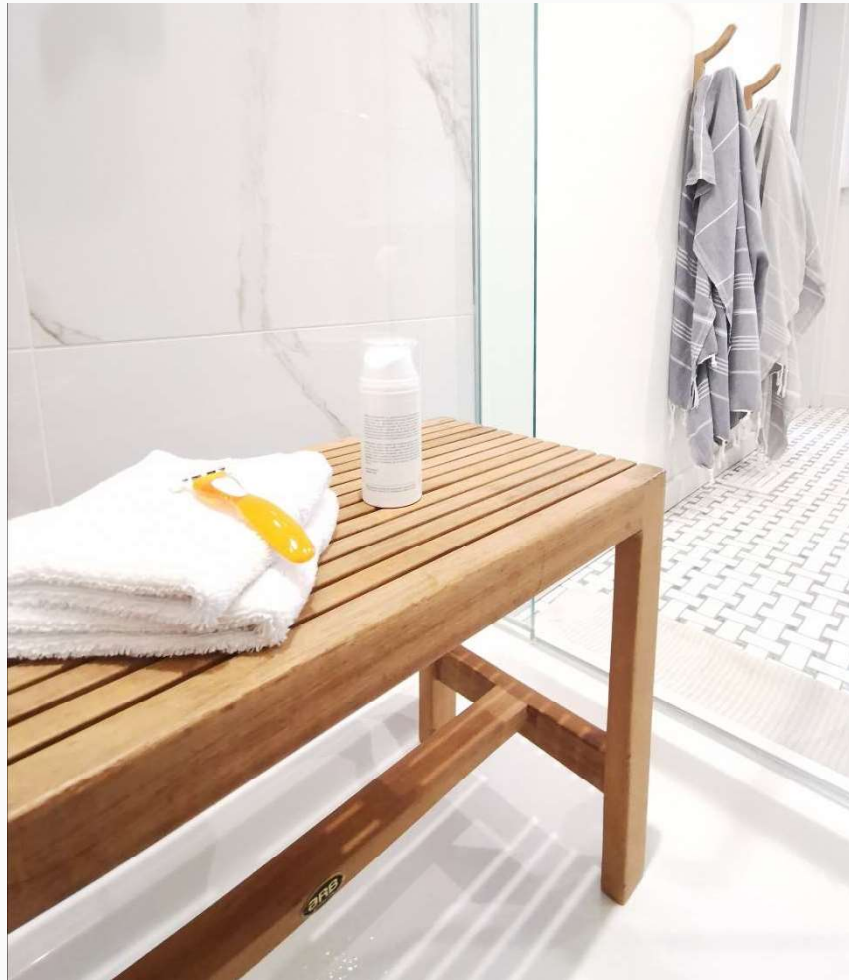
Run your hand over a piece of natural teak furniture. The oily/sand texture is always warm to the touch and will never snag, warp or splinter.
