

STORYPOD'S FRIDA KAHLO LESSON PLAN

(Ages: 4+)

Use the Storypod Frida Kahlo Craftie and this lesson plan to teach kids about the following themes:

- ✓ Inclusion and Overcoming Bullying
- Resilience
- Kindness
- Language Skills and intro to Spanish words

Trivia Questions:

At the end of the Frida Kahlo Craftie, there will be audio trivia questions to reflect on with the class.

How did this story make you feel?




Activity Ideas:



Self-Portrait Collage:

• Show the children some of Frida Kahlo's self-portraits and discuss how she expressed herself through art.



- Encourage them to create their own self-portraits by cutting out facial features and other elements from the magazines and arranging them on a piece of paper.
- · Or, have students draw their own self portraits or a scene from Frida's life

Nature Inspired Art:

- Introduce Frida Kahlo's love for nature and her use of natural elements in her artwork.
- Take the children on a nature walk or bring in various natural materials like leaves, flowers, and twigs.
- Provide paper, paint, and glue for the children to create their own nature-inspired artwork, similar to Frida Kahlo's style.

Dress Like Frida:

- · Show the children pictures of Frida Kahlo and discuss her unique fashion sense.
- Encourage the children to create their own Frida-inspired outfits using colorful scarves, flowers, and other accessories.
- Organize a mini-fashion show where the children can showcase their creations and share what they like about Frida's style.

Emotions in Art:

- Discuss with the children how Frida Kahlo expressed her emotions through her artwork.
- Show them some of her paintings that depict different emotions.
- Provide paper, crayons, and markers for the children to create their own artworks representing different emotions they feel.

Kahlo's Favorite Animals:

- Talk about Frida Kahlo's love for animals, especially monkeys and birds.
- Show pictures of these animals and discuss their characteristics.
- Provide coloring pages or templates of monkeys and birds for the children to color or paint, encouraging them to use bright colors like Frida did in her paintings
