### São Bento

Train station with beautiful azulejo tile murals depicting Portugal's history, peoples, & regions

### Torre dos Clérigos

18th c. Baroque church with 246 f bell tower. Climb the spiral staircase for views of the city

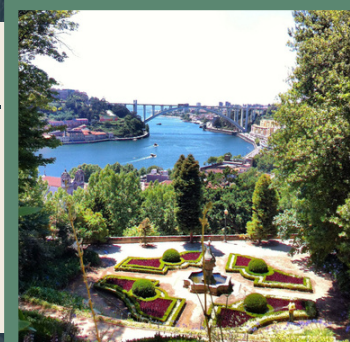


### Santa Catarina

One of the most famous streets in Porto, this is the shopping epicenter of the city

### Jardins do Palácio de Cristal

Beautiful gardens with panoramic views of the Douro & Atlantic



### Foz do Douro

Yes, beaches are just a short tram or bike ride from the city center!

### Escadas

Get lost in a maze of stairways, that wind down the hill to the Douro

## THINGS TO SEE



### Livraria Lello

One of the oldest bookshops in Portugal & one of the top bookshops in the world!

### Ribeira

The riverside area is a feast for the eyes, with so many notable landmarks all in view



### Ponte de Dom Luís I

You can cross both the top & bottom of the bridge to reach Gaia where a cable car can take you up or down again

### Sé do Porto

The Cathedral was built in the 12th c. & is remarkable from the outside & even more beautiful inside



### Vila Nova de Gaia

Cross the river to Gaia & it's Port houses & boat tours down the Douro

### Jardim do Morro

Aruguably the best spot to watch the sunset as it sets in to the Douro & Atlantic beyond

This cozy space offers an international fusion of tapas-style dishes prepared by the chef in front of you - try the grilled mussels!



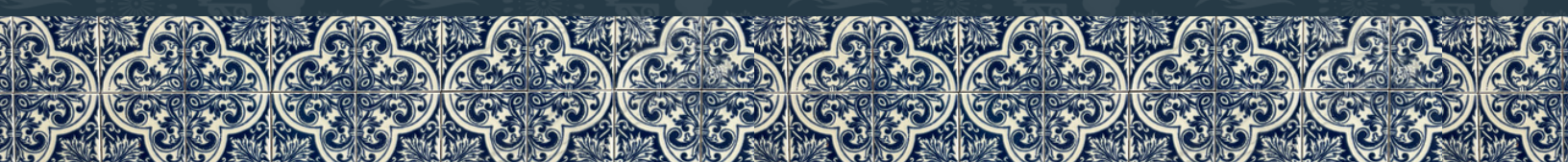
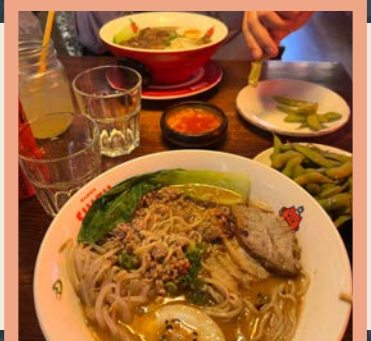
### Holy Sandwich Shop

If you're missing the taste of home then this cute & relaxed burger place is for you - the Fatmelt is a must!



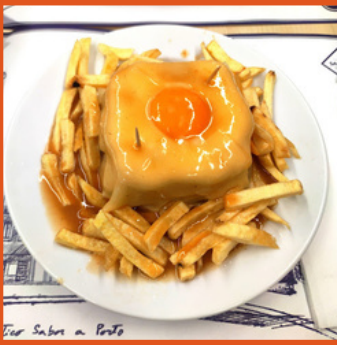
### Ramen Shifu

# PORTO

## MUST-HAVE DISHES



### Francesinha

A steak & ham sandwich, with melted cheese in a tomato & beer sauce with an egg

### Pastel de Nata

Egg custard tart pastry dusted with cinnamon



### Bacalhau

Just simply - cod - it is often dried & salted, but comes in many forms in many delicious dishes

### Sardinhas

Fresh or tinned, grilled or fried, these little guys are quintessentially Portuguese



### Caldo Verde

Soup made from Portuguese cabbage, potatoes, onion, garlic & chorizo

### Bifana

A sandwich made from pork cooked in wine & garlic, is traditionally eaten at festivals





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## MUST-HAVE DISHES



### Serra de Estrela

Portugal's oldest cheese is made from sheep's milk, with a hard rind and soft center

### Leitão

Roasted piglet, with crunchy skin & soft creamy flesh, is typically paired with sparkling wine



### Alheira

A smoked sausage made from chicken, bread & garlic, traditionally served before a meal

### Rojões

A stew made from the fatter cuts of pork with white wine, garlic, cumin & corinader



### Cabidela

A chicken and rice dish made with blood but don't be put off, it's delicious!

### Prego

A garlic steak sandwich, usually served with an egg & mustard is the perfect bar snack
