This new series is designed for students who require instruction in a specific comprehension skill. Students will enjoy building their knowledge through reading the contemporary non-fiction passages in the workbooks. Each book begins by providing instruction on how to strengthen the target skill. The *Main Idea* workbook contains 35 passages followed by a set of questions requiring students to identify the main idea and supporting details. The *Inferences and Conclusions* workbook, which contains 20 passages, requires students to read closely and provide textual evidence to support inferences. The *Vocabulary* workbook provides instruction and activities in six areas: context clues, metaphors and similes, idioms, homophones, roots and affixes, and using the dictionary. The *Fact and Opinion* workbook contains 19 passages, each followed by a set of statements that provides practice in discerning between facts and opinions. The series's content is derived from the following themes: history, environment, nature and science, people, health, social issues, law, sport, and labour. An answer key is included at the back of each workbook. (48 pp.)

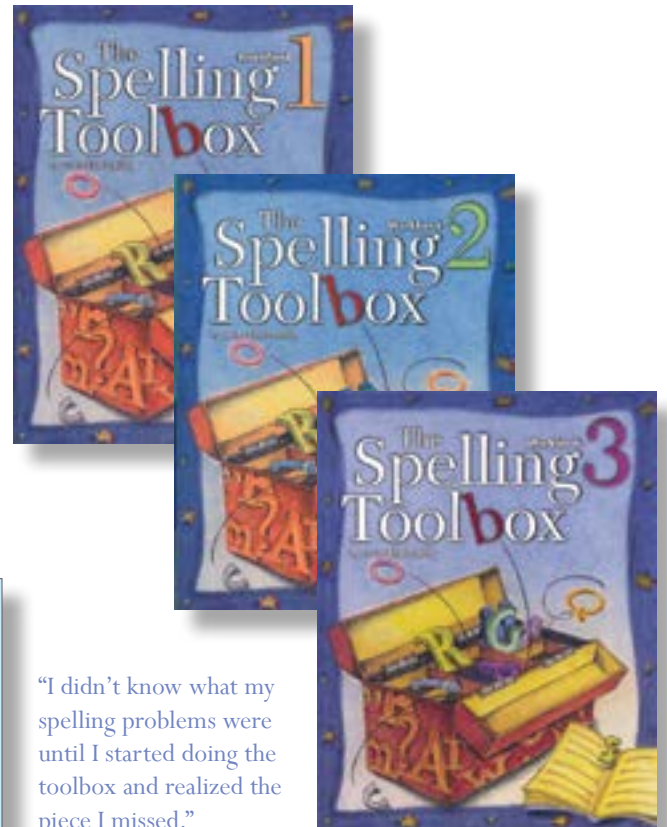

These workbooks promote a strategy-based approach to spelling. Each workbook provides an introductory lesson that describes the spelling “tools,” and 20 thematically organized units on the topics of home, community, work, health, and writing. In each unit, the student learns how to spell 15 words by using phonics, syllabication, word families, and a spelling rule. Dictation and an application activity are provided so the student can try out the spelling strategies that have been learned. Application activities include tasks such as writing a notice to a landlord, making a shopping list, filling in a form for a free offer, and making a to-do list.

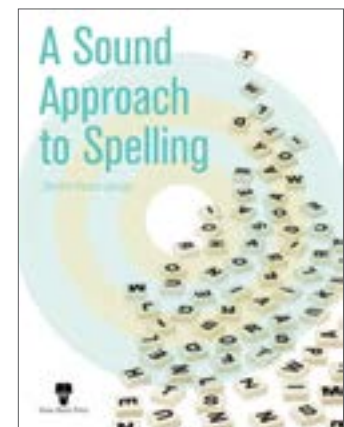

A Sound Approach to Spelling is for students who can spell consonant sounds and blends, but have difficulty spelling vowel patterns. In their attempt to correctly spell a vowel sound, students often mix up, omit, or add extra letter sounds. The workbook is comprised of 15 units, with each unit teaching one vowel sound. In each unit, four strategies are utilized to teach the target vowel sound: word sorts; word families; look, say, cover, write, check; and word analysis. Each unit closes with two dictations that enable students to analyze and study spelling errors. **This book is reproducible.**

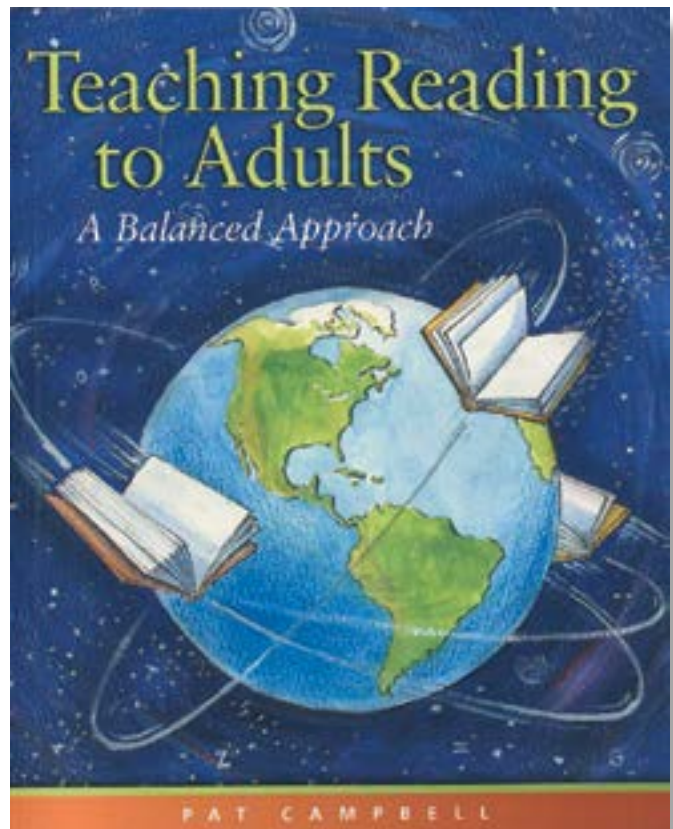

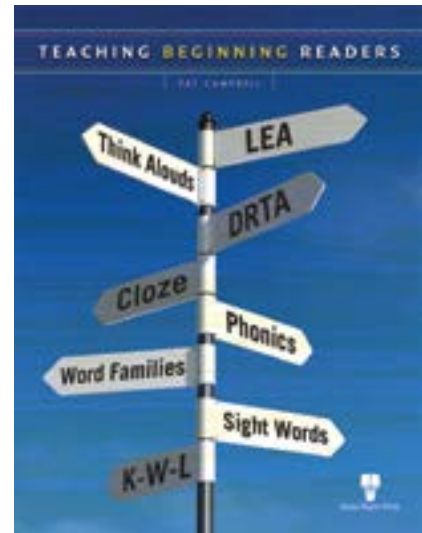

This manual begins with a compelling story about Clarence, a man who learned to read at the age of 93. The next section presents a list of ten principles for teaching beginning readers. This is followed by responses to three frequently asked questions:

(1) Where do I start? (2) Do I need to teach skills in a particular order? and (3) What do I teach? The manual's primary focus is the description of 20 instructional strategies and activities such as language experience, echo reading, and word families. Many strategies are geared towards educators who work in a one-to-one tutoring situation; however, each strategy can be modified for classroom instruction. The manual concludes with sample lesson plans, a resource list, and glossary. Please note that the strategies and lesson plans can be photocopied. (74 pp.)
