



TIME

WASH ROUTINE (EXTERIOR ONLY)

RULES

1  3-4 minutes

Make wheel (BRUTE) and paint (FOAM) buckets
Fill wheel bucket with 3-4 squirts of BRUTE and brushes
Fill paint bucket with 3-4 squirts of FOAM and 2-5 MF towels

- Park car out of sun.
- Clean out buckets and tools to get best results from soaps.
- Add BOOST if driving in salty conditions.

2  8-10 minutes

ENGINE
Degrease (TITAN12)
BRUTE + Wheel brushes
Light rinse
Towel or compressed air

- Slightly warm engine is better than cold or very hot
- Use FROTHER if working on older engine or exposed sensitive areas.

3  1-2 minutes

PRE-WASH
TITAN12 on front bumper + behind wheel wells
TITAN12 on door jambs
Allow to dwell out of direct sunlight

- Skip pre-wash, unless excessively dirty, bug-covered, or driving on salty roads.

4  10-12 minutes

WHEELS
TITAN12 in plastic wheel wells
Pre-rinse + PLUM on wheel and rubber
Backside of rim and caliper (Wheel Woolie)
Front of rim with brush and mitt
Scrub Tires / rubber seals if needed
Scrub wheel well with Woolie or scrub brush
Rinse and repeat

- If you choose to remove wheels, start with suspension, calipers and wheel wells first.
- Wait for wheels and brakes to cool before applying PLUM.

5  3-4 minutes

DOOR JAMBS
Clean with wheel brush or wheel mitt

- Stay away from purposeful door grease
- Focus agitation on lower rubber seals

6  2 minutes

PRE-RINSE
Pressure washer or hose to knock off loose dirt

- Focus on seams, door gaps, and hood, trunk and door jambs

7  5-7 minutes

PAINT
Lubricating soap in foam cannon or Aerator based on condition
Agitate with blue ultra-thick MF towels
Interior brush on emblems

- Use FOAM for neutral pH cleaning and basic maintenance.
- Use BOOST for low pH, stronger cleaning.

8  2 minutes

RINSE

9  3 minutes

REFLEX PRO TOP COAT
Spray on wet paint and door jambs
Allow two minutes dwell time

- Spray 1-2 squirts per panel, including hood, trunk, and door jambs

10  1-2 minutes

RINSE (GENTLE)

- Light rinse to spread the coating into seams and jambs



TIME

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RULES

11



5-7 minutes

DRY

Soak MF towel, wring out (damp)
Fold into fours, spray HYDRATE onto towel
Wring out when full
Use compressed air or Master Blaster

12



5-7 minutes

GLASS

Spray 2-3 sprays of OBEY
Use Scrub Pad to lift dirt and oils
Scoop up dirty with MF towel
Spray mist of OBEY
Squeegee
Final buff with Waffle Weave MF Glass Towel

2-3 minutes

RUBBER AND TRIM

Apply MUD to foam applicator
Moisturize rubber in up/down and side/side motions for even coverage
Apply on wheel wells and trim is applicable

3-4 minutes

FINAL WIPE AND INSPECTION

Open all doors to flush out water and inspect work
Use SPIT with an MF towel for touch ups

10-20 minutes

PROTECTION AND BEAUTY

Add SKIN (protection) or REFLEX PRO FINISHING WAX (additional shine)
Buff clean with 2 MF towels

- MF towels will not remove all the water. Goal is lubrication during the drying process. Many need a follow-up wipe.
- For stubborn interior windshield streaks, use 50/50 mix of water and Isopropyl Alcohol to cut through grease. Cover dash in towels to soak up drips.
- Wear gloves - your hands will get oily.
- Use REVEAL to quickly show any missed dirt or wax residue.
- SKIN and REFLEX PRO FINISHING WAX are quick and easy maintenance applications that add 6+ months of protection.

TIME

INTERIOR CLEANING ROUTINE

RULES

1



3-4 minutes

EMPTY OUT CAR

Start on driver side and remove garbage and floor mats
Work from #1 clockwise around the car
Bring garbage can with you if needed

2



3-4 minutes

COMPRESSED AIR

Blow out under the seats, between seats, cup holders, dash, doors, etc.

3



3-4 minutes

HEADLINER

Mist SHAG on stains and blot with MF towel
If stain persists, repeat with interior brush agitation, then blot dry

4



15-20 minutes

PLASTIC, LEATHER, VINYL

Spray LATHER directly on surface
Agitate with interior brush or scrub pad
Immediately scoop up LATHER before it dries

5



5-7 minutes

VACUUM

Start with seat, seat seams, then floors in 1-5 workflow

6



15-25 minutes

SEATS

Spray SHAG on seats (if fabric), tamp in, then scrub with interior scrubber
Blot dry
Repeat on floor carpets

10-15 minutes

SHAMPOO

Steam-Vac both seats and carpets
Use garage wet-vac after heavy scrubbing if you do not have a shampoo or steam vac
Repeat in working pattern

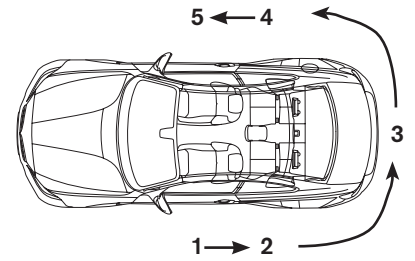


5-7 minutes

CONDITIONER

Apply MOUSSE to a MF applicator and massage into leather (if applicable)
Buff to a matte finish after 3 or 4 minutes of dwell time

- Working pattern front-back



- If you don't have compressed air, use a Master Blaster
- Skip if clean - do not touch unless needed.
- Do not over soak or use all-purpose cleaners
- Only use scrub pad if stain persists. Do not over-rub to avoid removing dye
- If you have a steamer, you can use it with LATHER instead of interior brush. The heat/steam will increase cleaning effectiveness.
- If using compressed air in step 2, then moving seats back and forth should not be necessary. Use your best judgment.
- Avoid using super stiff brushes on soft fabrics
- Always double check fabric seat cleaning, as stains can return once dry.
- Use heavy hot water extraction if excessively dirty
- Wet-vacs are a cheaper alternative.
- Can be used on plastics and vinyl for UV protection.
- Always buff dry for a matte finish.



INTERIOR TIPS

1. Only use TITAN 12 for carpet oil stains or door handle hand grease marks.
Avoid degreaser on headliners.
2. Use the least amount of water/moisture needed to do the job correctly. The more water used, the longer the dry time without professional vacuums and fans.
3. Never spray cleaners directly onto radios or gauge clusters to avoid leaking behind.
