PRODUCT CARE



Brass possesses a unique beauty and is admired for its undeniable quality. Nevertheless, brass is subject to some natural discolouration over time when exposed to air as everyone's local climate is different. Therefore, everyone will experience different effects on their brass products. Our brass products are coated with high-quality lacquer to act as a protective barrier and provide the longest possible life to their finish. However, nothing is absolute and even these lacquers have limitations, which means they may wear with varying amounts of use and changing environmental conditions. Brass is known to last for a long time, but its lacquered finish is not guaranteed to be an infinite protector.

Whilst some brassware is made to age and patina over time, our range is manufactured to retain the original finish. To maintain the beauty and quality of your brassware for years to come, proper care and maintenance should be routinely carried out.

BRASS

- Residue build-up may cause discolouration of the original finish. To avoid this, clean or brush
 with warm, soapy water then dry with a microfiber cloth soap to remove any remaining marks
 or fingerprints. It is recommended that this be done regularly and incorporated into the
 general cleaning routine of your space.
- Never use acid or alkali cleaners, abrasive solutions or scouring pads/creams as this may
 affect the thickness and effectiveness of protective coatings such as plating, powder coating
 and lacquers.
- Powder-coated finishes should be cleaned only with a damp cloth*

WOOD

- Clean with a damp, soft cloth or damp sponge using lukewarm water.
- Clean with neutral diluted detergent using lukewarm water.
- Dust wood regularly with a soft, dry, all-cotton cloth.
- Never use strong acid, alkali cleaners, abrasive cleaners or scouring pads as this may affect the texture and feel of the wood.

LEATHER

- Clean with quality leather cleaning products, carefully following the instructions of the manufacturer.
- Avoid using water to clean as this may leave marks. A dry, soft towel should be enough to clean superficial surface marks.

ACRYLIC

- Clean or brush with a mild soapy water solution then dry with a soft cloth or damp cellulose sponge to prevent water spotting.
- Never use window cleaning fluids with ammonia, gasoline, denatured alcohol, carbon tetrachloride, or acetone as this will cause the acrylic to break down and form irreversible waves or cracks.

^{*}Powder-coated finishes may chip with rough handling, and therefore caution should be taken during maintenance and use.
