French essay can be literally translated into experience, sample, attempt, sketch, essay. essay is a prosaic essay of small volume and free composition, expressing individual impressions and considerations on a particular issue and not necessarily claiming a defining or exhaustive interpretation of the subject. L.P. Krysin's "Explanatory Dictionary of Foreign Language Words" defines the essay as "an essay that interprets any problems not in a systematic scientific form, but in free form.

"The "Great Encyclopedic Dictionary" gives the following definition: "An essay is a genre-philosophical, literary-critical, historical-biographical, journalistic prose that combines an accentuated individual position of the author with a relaxed, often paradoxical presentation, focused on conversational speech.

"The Concise Literary Encyclopedia clarifies: "An essay is a prosaic essay of a small volume and free composition that interprets a private theme and represents an attempt to convey individual impressions and considerations, or otherwise related to it. Some features of an essay are: the presence of a specific theme or question. A work devoted to the analysis of a wide range of problems, by definition, can not be performed in the genre of essays. An essay expresses individual impressions and considerations on a particular subject or question and does not necessarily claim to be a defining or exhaustive interpretation of the subject. -as a rule, an essay suggests a new, subjectively colored word about something, such a work may have a philosophical, historic-biographical, journalistic, literary-critical, scientific-popular or purebelletristic character. - The content of an essay evaluates primarily the personality of the author - his worldview, thoughts and feelings.

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This genre has become popular in recent years. The creator of this essay genre is M. Montaigne ("Experiences", 1580). Today, the essay is offered as a task quite often. It is one of the main components of the package of documents (admission to an educational institution or employment). Essay contest helps the best to choose the best! It is important to write an essay for a young specialist as well. The way the candidate managed to present himself, how he described his achievements and shortcomings, allows the employer to determine whether this person is good enough for business, enough work experience to justify the hopes in the future and to benefit the company (organization, enterprise). The aim of the essay is to develop such skills as independent creative and written expression of one's own thoughts.

Writing an essay is extremely useful because it allows the author to learn how to clearly formulate thoughts, structure information, use the basic concepts, highlight the cause and effect, illustrate the experience with appropriate examples, and argue their conclusions. The most relevant topic for the essay of a young specialist is "Me and my career". The topic of the essay is given to make it easy for the commission (employer) to assess the features of your thinking, creativity, enthusiasm and potential. The best way to achieve this result is to write directly and frankly, remaining honest with yourself. If you are not honest, there is every chance that your essay will be considered unnatural. The structure and plan of the essay The structure of the essay is determined by the requirements placed on it: 1. The thoughts of the author of the essay on the problem are presented in the form of brief theses (T). 2. The thought must be supported by evidence - therefore, the thesis is followed by arguments (A). Arguments are facts, phenomena of social life, events, life situations and life experience, scientific evidence, references to the opinion of scientists, etc. It is better to give two arguments in favor of each thesis: one argument seems inconclusive, three arguments can

"overload" the presentation made in a genre oriented to brevity and figurativeness. Thus, an essay acquires a circular structure (the number of theses and arguments depends on the topic, the chosen plan, the logic of thought development): -introduction-thesis, arguments-thesis, arguments-conclusion. When writing an essay, it is also important to consider the following points:

1. The introduction and the conclusion should focus on the problem (in the introduction it is put, in the conclusion - the author's opinion is summarized).
2. It is necessary to highlight paragraphs, red lines, to establish a logical connection: this is how the integrity of the work is achieved.
3. Style of presentation: an essay is characterized by emotionality, expressiveness, artistry. Specialists believe that short, simple, varied in tone sentences, skilful use of the "most modern" punctuation mark
