



Tips, Tricks and Information for Dark Transfer Paper

- Prior to transferring an image, make sure that the fabric is completely flat with no wrinkles. Quickly iron the surface before transferring to remove any wrinkles or moisture.
- Dark Transfer Paper is compatible with all desktop inkjet printers. You must use one of these printers for best results.
- Any excess paper around your image that is transferred onto your fabric shows up as white, meaning you must cut out your image if you do not want a white outline to show.
- Peel the backing off of the printed image and lay it down print side up, like you would a sticker prior to applying heat.
- Make sure that your iron setting is on cotton. Cover the image with parchment paper before applying heat, then iron for two minutes.
- If your image appears to be coming up in areas, place the parchment paper back down and continue to apply heat and pressure until the image is completely adhered to the fabric.
- To ensure quality, make sure to turn your garment inside out and wash in cold water after transfer is complete.
