## INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE THE OPERATION

### A. PACKAGE CONTENTS:

- 1. DT500 Money Counter
- 2. Cleaning and service kit
- Power Cord
- 4. Fuses (x2)

### B. UNPACKING

After unpacking the machine, please store the box and the packing material for future use. Failing to ship the machine back in its original machine box, Styrofoam and packing material will void the machine's warranty.

### C. INSTALLATION

Please follow below step by step instructions:

- 1. Place the machine on a solid flat surface before using.
- Please review the safety considerations to carefully chose an appropriate workspace. environment to operate the machine.
- 3. Connect the power cord to machine power supply port (back of the machine).
- 4. Connect the power cord to a grounded wall outlet or ground protection socket.
- 5. Ensure voltage operating range: AC 110~220V / 50~60HZ.
- 6. Turn the machine ON and verify if its functioning properly. In case of any error msg, please contact the service center for help.

NOTE: WHEN REPLACING FUSES, MAKE SURE TO USE THE SAME TYPE AND RATING (F3A~250V). THE FUSES ARE LOCATED IN THE POWER JACK COMPARTMENT.

## D. NOTES SELECTION

To ensure a trouble-free operation before starting, please make sure to:


- 1. Tidy up the notes on an even desk.
- 2. Set the position of the counting guide (refer to main parts overview) to be 2mm to 3mm longer than the notes to be counted.
- 3. Place the notes onto the hopper stage of the machine and start the count.
- The results will be displayed on the screen. Press Report to get a detailed count result.

#### Careful considerations

- Avoid counting wet, excessively dirty, folded or curved notes.
- Fan each bundle of notes before counting in the case the notes are slightly adhesive one each other.
- Check for foreign objects mixed up with the notes like paper clips, rubber bands, pieces of paper, etc.

## C. FRONT PANEL FUNCTIONAL KEYS

### MODE

This button is used to switch among CNT mode (count), SDC mode (Single Denomination Count) & MDC mode (Mixed Denomination Count)

### **START**

This button is used to start counting when notes are placed on the Hopper. It also allows the user to switch from Auto (default) to Manual counting by pressing the Start button long enough (over 5 seconds) until it switches to Manual and then release the button. Repeat this exercise If you need to switch back to Auto.

### CUR

This button is used to display available currencies and allow you to choose the required counting currency by pressing the arrow keys (Up and Down). Press Ok to confirm your selection. Auto will recognize the first currency note and count only this currency. Mix can count the first 4 currencies (only under MDC mode)

## **BATCH**

This button is used to switch ON/OFF the batch mode. This function is used to create stacks of an equal number of notes. When BATCH is on, 100pcs is shown as default on the display. Use the arrow keys (Up and Down) to adjust the batch number. Press Start to confirm your selection and start the count. You will get a notification on the display when the batch is complete

### **ADD**

This button is used to switch on/off the Add function. It allows you to Add an additional stack of notes without resetting the previous count. The total value count will be the result of multiple counts. You can use ADD along with the BATCH function

## **SORT**

This button is used to turn on/off the face or orientation sorting function under the main interface. The Face feature sort notes with the same side. The Orientation feature sort notes in the same direction and side.

## **REPORT**

Press to check the counting report: the report screen shows the amount and value per Denomination and the total quantity of notes (PCS)

### **UP ARROW**

This button is used to adjust speed levels upward. When BATCH is on, press this button to increase the Batch number

### OK

Press to confirm the selection. Use this button to print the results in the report interface

## **DOWN ARROW**

This button is used to adjust speed levels downward. The lower the speed, the more accurate the detecting functionalities. When BATCH is on, press this button to decrease the Batch number

## **OPERATION**

### A. OPERATION MODES

Press the MODE Button sequentially to select the desired operating mode. You can find the selection on the top right of the display

- 1. CNT MODE: This mode is used to derive the quantity of notes counted (PCs). It works on all notes even for currencies that are not programmed on this machine. Under this mode, the machine works as a conventional note counter (note that all the detection functions are disabled in this mode). It's also used in case the fitness condition of the notes is poor and not well recognized (rejected) in MDC mode. You can select 3 different counting speeds 800, 1000, 1200 & 1500 notes/min. In this mode, you can switch on ADD or BATCH or ADD+BATCH functions
- 2. SDC MODE: Press button MODE to select SDC mode. This mode is used to count single denomination notes. The system will take the first note as the benchmark and alert you to remove other denominations from the stacker. The result will be t he Total amount of money (Total Value) and quantity of notes (PCs) counted for the same denomination. You can select 2 different counting speeds 800 and 1000 notes/min. In this mode, you can switch on ADD or BATCH or ADD+BATCH functions
- 3. MDC MODE: Press button MODE to select MDC mode. This mode is used for value counting of Mixed Denomination notes. Press REPORT button to check the counting details. The result is the Total amount of money (Total value) as well as quantity of notes (PCs) counted. You can select 2 different counting speeds 800 and 1000 notes/min. In this mode, you can switch on ADD or BATCH or ADD+BATCH functions

## B. COUNTING OPERATION

- Proceed to turn the machine ON.
- 2. The machine will start with a short Self-Test routine to confirm the proper operation of all its module before starting the counting. If any error is reported, check the ERROR MESSAGES section for solving the problem.
- 3. Ensure the Hopper Wheel is adjusted properly (check out page 13 Thickness Wheel Adjustment Procedure)
- Select the required Currency (for multi-currency models) as well as the operating mode (CNT-SDC-MDC)
- Set up the rest of the options like SPEED, BATCH/ADD and SORT based on your own needs.
- 6. Place the notes orderly in the hopper and the machine will start counting them automatically.
  - NOTE: If the machine is set up in MANUAL, you must press START to begin the counting operation.

### C. PRINTING

Plug the Printer cable in the machine printing interface (RS-232C Serial Port). Once connected, Turn On the machine, ensure the baud rate is correctly setup (check settings 1.11 section) and start the count. Press Report Button once. Press the OK Button to print the Total value and quantity of notes result.

## D. MISCOUNTING ERRORS

In case the machine is not having an accurate counting operation, proceed as follow:

- Ensure that the notes are placed orderly in the hopper.
- · Check the counting sensors for dust or any other kind of malfunctioning source.
- Verify the note thickness adjustment mechanism (feeding gap) in case it needs to be re-adjusted for improving the machine performance (use the Thickness Wheel).
- If MG or UV or DD errors messages are reported frequently, proceed to verify the functions sensitivity and consider reduce them in case you confirm the current sensitivity value is too high. We highly advice to contact the support team prior to adjusting the default factory sensitivity values.

## E. THICKNESS WHEEL ADJUSTMENT PROCEDURE (FEEDING GAP)

When the notes are improperly fed into the machine, please adjust the notes thickness in the hopper by turning the note adjustment Thickness Wheel located on the back of the machine.



Proceed with this calibration when the notes are not fed smoothly through the machine or several error messages are occurring too often like Double Bills, Chain or miscounting errors.

Other reasons that might require to readjust the feeding gap are:

- · The counting of new or mint condition notes
- The counting of poor or bad fitness condition notes
- · Polymer notes and Paper-made notes counted together

## **OPERATION**

Having the correct feeding gap adjusted will ensure a smooth counting as well as a trouble-free operation. Trial and error attempts are recommended before you make the final adjustment.

- When the hopper is too tight, please loosen it by toggling the wheel to "-". It
  works for used (thicker) notes, adjust toward "+" to increase the gap
- When the hopper is too loose, please tighten it by toggling the wheel to "+".
   It works for new (thinner) notes and Polymer notes to reduce the gap
- We advise to keep it to Neutral mode otherwise small ad-justment toward
   "+" direction works best

## F. REMOVING JAMMED NOTES

When notes are stuck in the machine, please open the machine from the back and remove the notes. Once the stuck notes are removed, press start to resume the count



## **OPERATION**

In case notes are jammed inside the transporting mechanism, please follow below instructions:

- 1. Proceed to open the back compartment pushing down the lock lever located at the back at the same time you pull it toward you.
- 2. If you notice you can reach the note easily using your fingers, then proceed to remove it carefully. Otherwise if it is difficult to reach or stuck with the transporting rollers, then proceed to turn the machine OFF before any attempt to remove the note.
- 3. Do not use any tool or metallic instrument to remove the note since it might damage other components accidentally.
- 4. Make sure to remove any remaining debris in case the note is broken.
- 5. Close the compartment properly after finishing to extract the note.



## **SERVICE MENU**

In order to access the SET MENU, Press the OK button until you are prompted to input a password. The default password is  $\downarrow\downarrow\downarrow\downarrow$ .

You can use the arrows to select a sub-menu. Press OK button to confirm your selection and press BATCH button to return to the previous page.

### 1. USER MENU

You can use the arrows to scroll through the sub-setting menu and press ok to confirm your selection. Press Batch if you want to return to the previous page. Press Start to go back to the main display and start counting.

For each of the sub-setting features, once adjusted, press the Start button to confirm and save your selection. Press Batch if you want to go back to Settings without saving.

Note any changes you make in the sub-setting menu will auto-save if you exit by pressing OK (However it will reset to the default setting once you reset the machine). Please ensure you press Start to save prior to exit.

CAUTION: Please do not change sub-settings which have the following mark [\*] without reaching out to the support team for advice and guidance.

#### 1.1. UV [\*]

Allow the user to adjust the sensitivity of the UV detection function. UV-0 is OFF / UV-9 is Highest / UV-5 default

#### 1.2. MGS [\*]

Allow the user to adjust the sensitivity of the MG detection function. MG-0 is OFF / MG-9 is Highest / MG-1 default

#### 1.3. MGB [\*]

Allow the user to adjust the sensitivity of the MG detection function. MG-0 is OFF / MG-9 is Highest / MG-1 default

#### 1.4. Double Sensitivity [\*]

Allow the user to adjust the sensitivity of the DB detection function (Double Bill). DB-0 is OFF / DB-9 is Highest / DB-3 default

#### 1.5. Width Threshold [\*]

Allow the user to adjust the sensitivity of the DD detection function (Width). WT-0 is OFF / WT-9 is Highest / WT-4 default

#### 1.6. Height Threshold [\*]

Allow the user to adjust the sensitivity of the DD detection function (Width). WT-0 is OFF / WT-9 is Highest / WT-2 default

#### 1.7. Start Sensor Threshold [\*]

Allow the user to adjust the Start Sensor Sensitivity in Auto Count when the notes color are too dark. higher values increase the sensitivity of the sensor.

#### 1.8. Clear Sensor Threshold [\*]

Allow the user to clear the data from the last count. When notes are removed from the stacker post each count, the machine display will clear-zero. If the machine doesn't clear the last count display, please contact support team to advice on increasing the sensitivity or otherwise replace the sensor.

#### 1.9. Back-light Time

Allow the user to set the back-light time of the display screen when the machine is idle.

#### 1.10. Screen Brightness

#### 11. Printers Baud Rate Set

The baud rate is set at 9600. Please ensure the Thermal Printer is set at 9600.

#### 12. Stacker Capacity

Default capacity is set at 150notes. You can adjust the limit 0, 100, 150 & 200.

### 13. Brake Time Correction [\*]

Allow the user to adjust the sensitivity of brakes i.e. fast or slow break

#### 14. Time Setting

Adjust the time and date by using the Up and Down arrows. Press OK to transition through the clock diagram. Once adjusted, press the Start key to confirm your selection and start counting.

#### 15. Alarm Counting Selection

This function is set to OFF by default. When a suspicious bill is detected, the bill is not added to the count when the Alarm Count is switched OFF

#### 16. Buzzer Switch

Allow the user to the switch on/off the counting beep by using the Up & Down arrows

#### 17. Currency Switching Mode

Allow the user to change the interface when switching between currencies

#### 18. Debug Print Mode (This feature is not available)

## 2. CIS CALIBRATION

When it's necessary to adjust CIS sensor (often need when the display shows repeatedly IMAGE or IR ERROR), please follow below step by step instructions or reach out to our support team for help.



- Open the Upper back cover using the handle and place the white plastic strip in the machine.
  Please clear the CIS sensors prior to performing this task using the brush provided as part of the maintenance kit
- Select the CIS Calibration sub-menu by pressing the OK button. You will be prompted to Put in the Test Bar (White Plastic Strip). Press Ok when ready.
- 3. You should get the following notification "CIS Adjust Complete" if successful. Please take out the Test Bar (White Plastic Strip) and proceed to the CIS color balance process (Page 19).
- 4. If the CIS adjustment fails, you get the following notification (CIS adjust exposure failed!). Please restart the machine by pressing the OFF/ON switch and try again this process until its successfully adjusted.

Please contact support@deteckusa.com if the CIS calibration keeps failing.

## 3. CIS COLOR BALANCE

We recommend checking the video posted on our FAQ section "how to perform the CIS Color Balance". Please visit www.deteckusa.com/support

Below detailed steps on how to adjust the ColorBalance:

- 1. Select the CIS ColorBalance sub-menu by pressing the OK button. You will be prompted to Put in the White Plastic Card.
- 2. Open the back cover and insert the White Plastic Card provided in the maintenance kit. Press OK when ready
- 3. When the Color Balance is complete, press Start to exit.
- 4. Use the Hopper Wheel to manually roll down the White Plastic Card through the stacker area or Open the back compartment to remove the Card.

### 4. VERSION NUMBER

This function helps extract the latest version of the machine.

## 5. DATA-COLLECTION

This function is used in case we need to receive Image Data to analyze the errors you might be experiencing. Please contact the Support Team and we will assist you on the process.

## 6. RESTORE FACTORY SETTINGS

This function allows the user to restore the factory settings.

Following these periodic cleaning routines, will help to keep the machine in the optimum condition for ensuring a trouble-free operation as well as to extend the machine's lifespan.

DAILY ROUTINE: Perform the following steps on a daily basis:

- 1. Turn Off the machine when not in use.
- 2. With a clean dry cloth or a brush remove the dust deposited on the hopper and the stacker area.

WEEKLY ROUTINE: Perform the following steps on a weekly basis:

- 1. Turn off the machine and unplug its power cord.
- 2. Open the back cover carefully.
- 3. Use an air duster can and a brush to carefully remove the dust from the note passages areas.
- 4. Inspect the CIS sensors to verify if they are stained with ink and use a cloth slightly soaked in alcohol to clean the CIS sensor surface only in the case it has residues of ink from the notes. Please refer to the Self Check Error Code section below


#### A. HOPPER SENSOR ERROR:
